The SISC World Scholar's Cup Team is invited to the morning magazine show Bagong Pilipinas aired on PTV - 4.

The SISC Academic Varsity brought home more than 101 gold and silver medals and trophies after competing against 4,000 plus students from 39 countries worldwide in the World Scholar's Cup Global Rounds held last June 18 - 23, 2018 in Kuala Lumpur, Malaysia.

# Traffic scheme for Luxembourg, Munich, Tropical & STAR campuses


To help decongest traffic during arrival and dismissal time, the following traffic schemes will be strictly implemented:

A. Traffic Guidelines for Luxembourg, Tropical & Munich Campuses

- NO PARKING ALONG TROPICAL AVE., CAA ROAD, MUNICH ST., AND THE LEGACY. These are tow-away zones. The school shall not be liable for any towed vehicles parked in the towing zone area
- Follow designated entrance and exit lanes.
- The inner lane is only for vehicles whose passengers are already waiting at the gate. Drivers whose wards are not yet at the gate, should never stall the traffic by staying more than a minute in the inner lane. Drivers should move on and come back when their wards are waiting at the gate.

- The outer lane should be kept open all the time for vehicles moving out.
- B. Traffic Guidelines for STAR Campus
- NO PARKING ALONG ELIZALDE STREET. This is a tow-away zone. The school shall not be liable for any towed vehicles parked in the towing zone area.
- Vehicles coming from the Concha Cruz area are not allowed to do a U-Turn in Elizalde St. Instead, they should proceed to Aguirre St., make a U-Turn there, then turn right towards Elizalde Campus.
- U-Turn should be made after Batac St.

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# Guidelines on Suspension of Classes

With the typhoon season upon us, here are the guidelines that SISC adheres to:

#### 1. Pre-announced Suspension

Typhoon Signal	No Classes
Signal # 1	Preschool
Signal # 2	Preschool, Grade School, High School & IB 1-2
Signal # 3	Preschool, Grade School, High School, IB 1-2 & College

Depending on signal numbers declared at 10:00 p.m. and 4:30 a.m. of the following day, classes in determined levels for the whole day are deemed automatically cancelled/ suspended.

#### 2. Midday Suspension of Classes

Afternoon classes in the appropriate levels in areas with signal numbers declared at 11:00 a.m. that day are likewise automatically cancelled/ suspended. The staggered dismissal below will be followed:

Levels	Schedule
Preschool to Grade 2	11:30 AM
Grades 3 - 6	12:00 NN
Grades 6 - 9	12:30 PM
Grades 10 - 12	1:00 PM

Those with siblings may join the dismissal of their youngest sibling.

#### 3. Suspension from Local Government

In the absence of typhoon signal warnings from PAGASA, localized cancellation/ suspension of classes is implemented by local chief executives in their capacity as chairpersons of the Local Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Council. SISC follows this announcement (Parañaque for STAR Campus; Las Piñas for Munich, Luxembourg, and Tropical campuses) for the general safety of the students under our care.
