the more skilled you are in digital use, the more confident you will feel in managing your child's screen time & ensuring they get the most out of media.

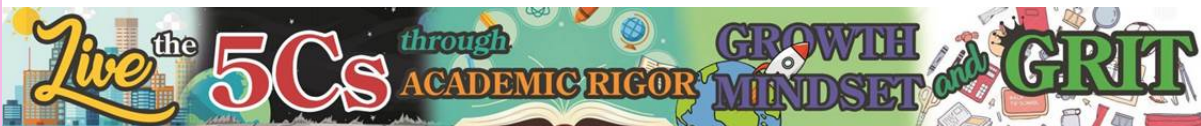
