

Monarchs shine in int'l Model UN conference

Six high school students from Southville International School and Colleges (SISC) bagged awards in the WE Model United Nations (WEMUN) Expo 2020 held virtually last **August 3-8**. **Park Jun Yeong (IB 1)** won as Best Delegate, **Kim Dong Hyun (IB 2)** was named Outstanding Delegate while Neel Sharma (**10-Commitment**) and **Choi Eun Jae (IB 1)** received Honorable Mention, and **Tyrulf Constantine Ekberg (10-Commitment)** and **Park Hyuk Jin (11-Efficiency)** got Verbal Commendation. SISC was awarded Best International Delegation in the largest permanent Model UN conference in Asia.
