MONARCH GETS PERFECT SCORE IN INTERNATIONAL MATH TEST



Gwyneth Margaux Tangog

A high school student from Southville International School and Colleges (SISC) got a perfect score in the 2020 Canadian Mathematics Contest conducted by the Center for Education in Mathematics and Computing (CEMC) of the University of Waterloo in Canada. Gwyneth Margaux G. Tangog of IB 1 achieved the perfect score of 150 in the Fermat Contest. She is one of the two students from the Philippines who earned the perfect score. Gwyn took the test last year, when she was in Grade 10.

Each year, more than 260,000 students from more than 80 countries register to join the CEMC's contests. Tangog was able to answer correctly all questions that asked for full solutions and strong analytical and problem solving skills, within the set time limit.



WANTED: MODEL DIGITAL CITIZENS IN SISC



With classes moving online, it is more important than ever for SISC students to practice responsible online behavior. The Model Digital Citizens of STAR, Munich Luxembourg and Campuses recognize Grades 1 -12 students who have shown by their words and actions that they understand and follow the appropriate technology use. They are

designed to recognize those who consistently build positive connections online, and treat others respectfully. Below are the kinds of behaviors expected from a Model Digital Citizen awardee:



- 1. Treats others with respect in online spaces and never cyberbullies.
- 2. Avoids using the chat box for side conversations and multitasking.
- 3. Does not post or share inappropriate material (even privately)
- 4. Mutes his/her microphone unless asked or acknowledged.
- 5. Switches his/her webcam on during synchronous classes without being told.
- 6. Is respectful at all times. He/She allows others to speak, invites others to share and respect other people's ideas.
- 7. Uses polite words at all times. He/She is aware of strong language, ALL CAPS and exclamation points.
- 8. Is careful with humor and sarcasm. He/She makes clear that he/she is being funny and not being rude.
- 9. Ensures that all written communication should be professional and reflects proper writing style. Keeps the smiley faces or emoticons away from academic papers.
- 10. Creates safe and secure passwords for all of his/her accounts and never uses the same passwords twice.
- 11. Protects his/her private information (address, email, phone) by monitoring privacy settings and understanding how websites can access his/her personal private information.
- 12. Practices caution and good judgement when sharing non-identifiable personal information with individuals online.
- 13. Does not steal or damage others' digital work, identity or property.
- 14. Makes appropriate decisions when communicating through a variety of digital channels.
- 15. Turns off geotagging on photos and reviews personal photography carefully before posting to ensure it does not reveal information he/she does not want to share.
- 16. Knows how to generate licenses for his/her own work and respects the intellectual property rights of others.
- 17. Secures permission for any work he/she shares online and provides proper citation.
- 18. Researches carefully the emails and assertions he/she encounters to protect against viruses, malware, phishing, ransomware and identity theft.
- 19. Demonstrates proper netiquette and presents himself/herself professionally online.
- 20. Is knowledgeable enough and acutely aware of the permanence of his/her digital presence and digital footprints that might impact his/her future.






