The Southville International School and Colleges (SISC) math aces did it again, winning a total of 5 medals in the 2020 Southeast Asian Mathematics Olympiad (SEAMO) held last October 3, 2020. Joshua Bautista of Gr. 8 - Integrity bagged a gold medal for placing in the Top 8% of his level. He also ranked 1st in the Local Ranking. Meanwhile, Gwyneth Tangog of IB1 pocketed a silver medal in the next 12% of hers. Other awardees are Park Ji Min of Gr. 10 - Commitment, Kim Minsuk of Gr. 10 - Conviction, and Jang Ku Hyo of Gr. 12 - Initiative also brought pride to the school by receiving bronze medals.

This year, the competition based on the Singapore Math's curriculum was done purely online. The winners qualify for the Global Round (SEAMO X 2020) featuring the top young mathematical minds from 20 countries.
