Yearend survey results show great faith in SISC online program

Southville International School and Colleges (SISC) values the feedback it receives from students and parents as working together is what makes the school such a special place to be. They were asked to complete a short survey about their views on a year of online learning and the overall response is one of satisfaction, gratitude and pride.

The scale of the questions was from 1 (strongly disagree) to 5 (strongly agree) and the results are as follows:

Academic Teaching

The students and parents agreed that the implementation and delivery of the Virtual Online Learning and Teaching (VOLT) Program was effective with a rating of 4.51.

Learning Opportunities

The school provides a safe online environment and a supportive virtual campus with a rating of 4.68.

Student Services

The school scored well in terms of online facilities and services with a rating of 4.49.

Communication

The communications from and with the school on general school updates and student academic progress work well with a rating of 4.57.
