SISC SETS NEW SCHOOL OPENING

In line with the recent announcement of the Department of Education to open classes in September, Southville International School and Colleges (SISC) has reset its opening of classes for academic year 2021-2022. The back-to-school dates for SISC students are as follows:

August 23, 2021 – College, International Baccalaureate and Senior High School (Grades 11-12)

August 31, 2021 – Grades 6-10

September 1, 2021 – Preschool to Grade 5, INNOVE and Southville FLEX

Originally, online classes in SISC are set to open in the first week of August. Adjusting the start to the last week of August or the first week of September will give students more time to be ready for the next virtual academic year and also for members of the SISC community to be vaccinated in preparation for, hopefully, a return to campuses soon.

SCHOOL PREPARES FOR SAFE AND SMART RETURN TO CLASSROOMS

Work is underway in SISC to prepare all classrooms in case the decision is made by the government and pertinent health agencies to reopen schools. Students will be assigned their own desks in the restructured classrooms that meet social distancing recommendations. All desks will face the same direction so students won't face one another and eliminate droplet transmission. The classrooms will likewise operate below their normal seating capacity with outside doors opened to improve air circulation.

The physical changes in the classrooms will be accompanied by operational changes such as extensively cleaning and disinfecting campuses every day, making wearing of face masks compulsory, doing daily temperature checks, and putting in place hand washing facilities and social distancing measures. SISC will exert every effort possible to make a return to campus as safe and healthy as possible while providing the best learning environment for all students.

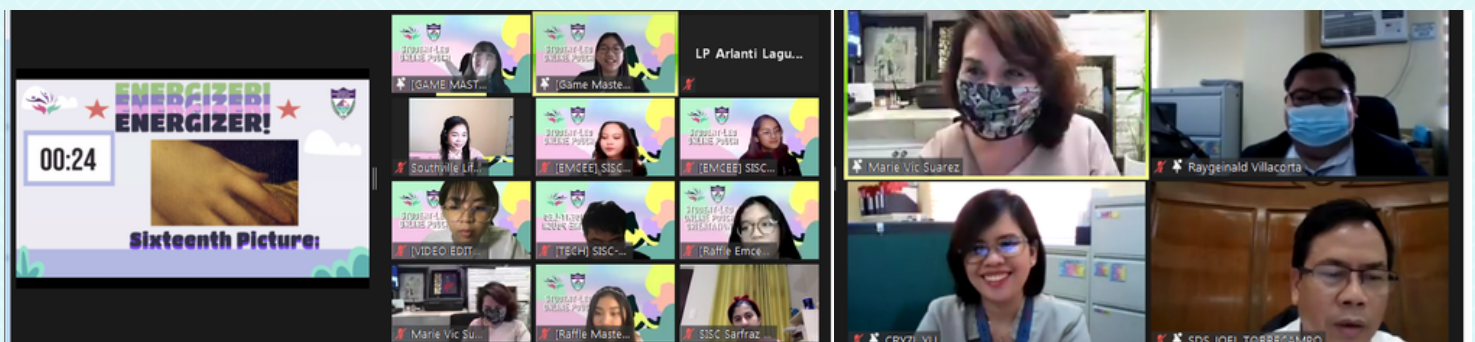


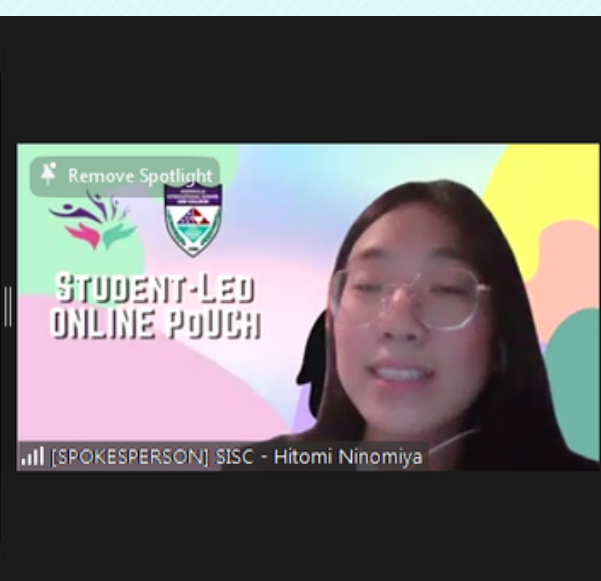
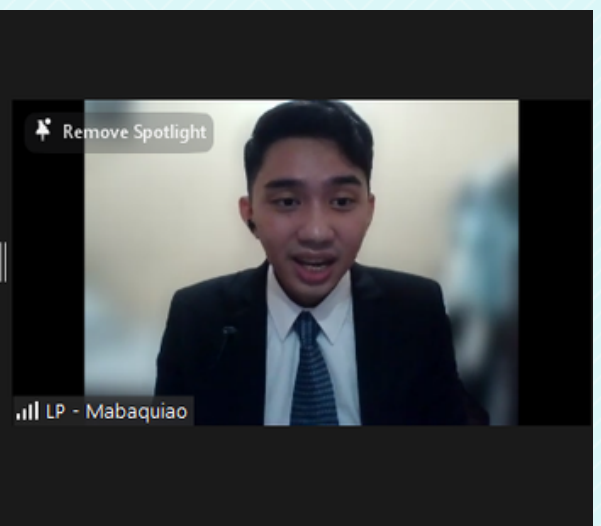
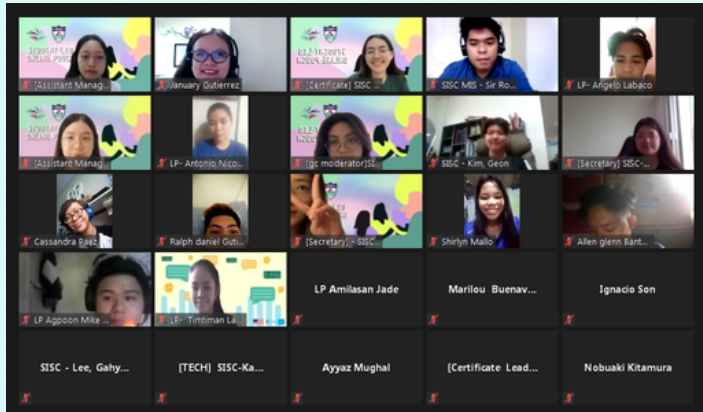
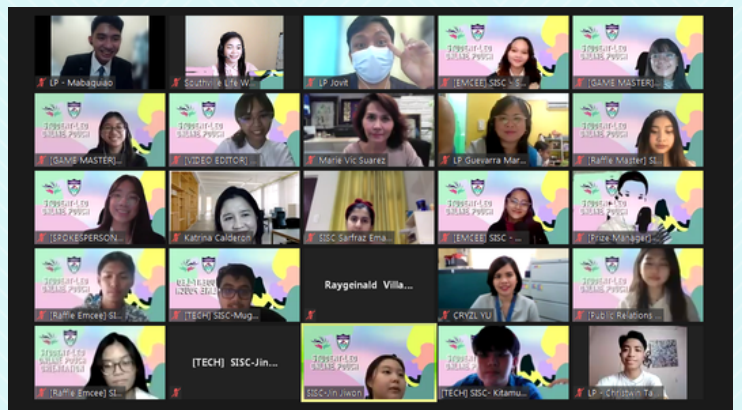
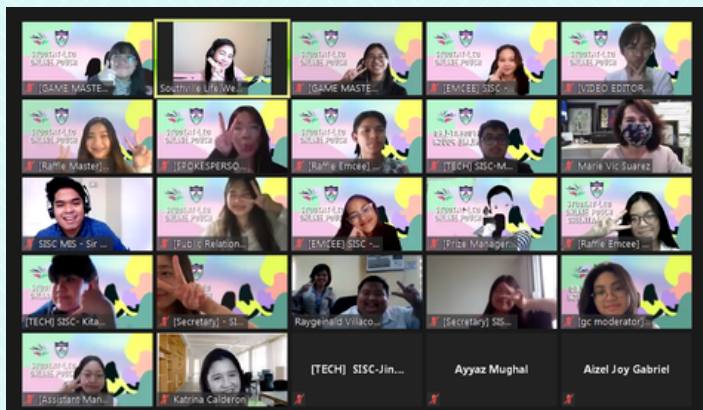


SISC HELPS PUBLIC SCHOOL PREPARE FOR NEW ACADEMIC YEAR

Amid the COVID-19 pandemic, the Save a Poor Urban Child (Po.U.Ch.) program of the school is finding ways to keep students in public schools healthy and learning. In a symbolic turnover held virtually last July 13 2021, Grades 8 – 12 students including alumni from SISC made a donation to their counterparts from Las Piñas National High School to support the latter's immediate needs. The donations include non-perishable food, books, thermal scanners, alcohol and Internet load.

The online PoUCh is aligned with this year's Brigada Eskwela, which is a Department of Education-led initiative that taps volunteers to address resource gaps faced by public elementary and secondary schools. SISC has been a partner of DepEd in this program for many years now, mobilizing its community to support the facility improvement program of its adopted public schools. For this year, the Brigada Eskwela was reconfigured to assist preparations for the new normal in education.
