NSPO Guidelines

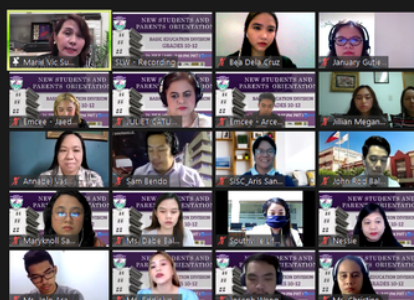
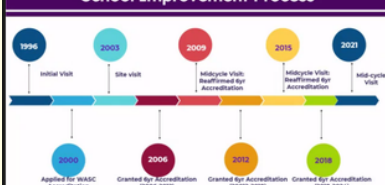
1. The program will start at exactly 1:00 P.M.

4. Parents or guardians are encouraged to stay beside their child during the program.



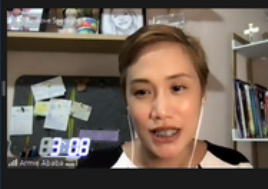

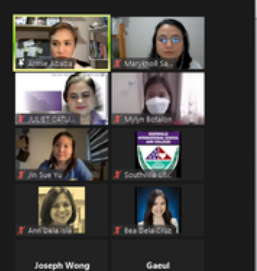
