SGEN HOLDS GROUNDBREAKING CEREMONY FOR NEW SCHOOL

The Southville Global Education Network (SGEN) broke ground on construction of what will become the Southville Monarchs International School. The new school is located in Antel Grand Village, General Trias, Cavite to offer the growing community the same academic facilities and standards of Southville International School and Colleges (SISC).

“In building this campus, Southville Monarchs International School is answering a call from students, parents and residents to provide high quality international education that will prepare learners for the demands of the 21st century,” SISC President Jocelyn Tizon said in the event. “We are sending out a powerful message to the people in Cavite that no one has to leave this region to find high quality educational experiences.”

The first phase of the project will be a one-storey building for

preschool to Grade 3 students that will slowly be developed into a two-storey building for all grade levels. The Southville Monarchs International School is the 8th member of SGEN that includes SISC, Southville International School and Colleges Affiliated with Foreign Universities, South Seed - Las Piñas Doctors Hospital College , South Mansfield College, Stonyhurst Southville International School - Malarayat, Stonyhurst Southville International School - Lipa, and Asian Seed Academy of Technology.





PTC SET ON APRIL 22

The Parent-Teacher Conference (PTC) regarding your child's school performance during the Second Term will be on April 22, 2022.

REGULAR CLASSES PAUSE FOR HOLY WEEK

Holy Week is a significant religious observance for the country's Christian majority as they commemorate the passion, death, and resurrection of Jesus Christ. There will be no synchronous classes from April 13 - 15, 2022 but SISC Moodle can still be accessed by students who wish to continue working on their tasks. Regular onsite and online classes will resume on April 18, 2022.

CHANGE IN TUITION FEES FOR AY 2022-2023

Considering the school's physical and technological upgrade as we shift to hybrid learning and customize classrooms, and the rising inflation cost, SISC has decided to increase tuition fees by 5% for Grades 1 to 12 for academic year 2022-2023. For Preschool, we will reinstate the tuition fee in 2019 before the pandemic.

The increase in tuition fees is the first time the school is doing it in three years as we acknowledge how difficult the period has been due to the pandemic. The decision was made after careful consideration of the needs of the students for a high quality, well-resourced education as they return to campus. We will continue to provide alternative payment schedules and options for your convenience.

RE-ENROLLMENT LETTER FOR ACADEMIC YEAR 2022 - 2023

Dear Parents/Guardians of Preschool to Grade 12,

Warm greetings!

A new year has started and we would like to thank you for your trust and strong support for Southville International School and Colleges (SISC).

Despite the challenges brought by the pandemic, we all have emerged victorious. This is very evident with the winnings of our students both locally and internationally, and the institutional recognition given by the Asian Pacific Quality Organization granting the school the Global Performance Excellence Award and citing the Virtual Online Learning and Teaching (VOLT) as an international platinum best practice.

As part of our efficient resource management for the new academic year, we would like to make a realistic projection of the student population for Academic Year 2022-2023. To achieve this, we need to determine how many of our present students are re-enrolling and how many of their siblings are enrolling as new students. For new students, we give priority to the siblings of our old students. Through this, we can allocate slots for new student applicants who are qualified for admission and are already waitlisted for enrollment.

This is also to inform you of the mode of learning for Academic Year 2022-2023.

Preschool, Grade School and High School students who have fully paid their accounts, have no academic deficiency, and have no discipline issues can already reserve a slot for academic year 2022-2023:

A. Early Enrollment:

There will be an early enrollment discount for students who will enroll from April 18, 2022 to June 15, 2022. A separate bulletin will be released for the guidelines. Tuition fees for AY 2022-2023 will be available by April 2022.

B. Entry Level Discounts

B.1 Entry Level Discounts for Grade 1, Grade 7, Grade 11, and IB 1.

Entry-level discounts apply only to SISC graduates who are enrolling in entry levels.

Entry-level discounts are available only for incoming Grade 1, Grade 7, Grade 11, and IB 1 students following the Matrix below.

Matrix of Entry-Level Discounts for Grade 1, Grade 7, Grade 11 and IB-1

LEVEL	SISC GRADUATES
Incoming Grade 1, 7 and 11	P5,000.00 on the tuition fee only
Incoming IB - 1	USD 300.00

C. Alumni Discount

1. Dependents of alumni who will be enrolling at SISC will enjoy Php 5,000 discount on the tuition fee of the regular rate for the first year of enrollment and Php 3,000 discount on TF for succeeding years.

2. Alumni who wish to pursue their graduate studies (MBA, MIT, MA Psychology) at SISC will enjoy a discount of 10% on tuition fee for one term and 5% on the subsequent terms.

Managing Mental Health and Emotional Well-being of students during Covid-19 school returns

School teachers and personnel are critical in children's transition back to in person classroom learning, particularly after extended periods of school closure.

Here are some ways teachers can support students' mental health during school returns.

- Listens to children's concerns
- Check how student are doing
- Provide children with accurate information about covid-19
- Seek suggestions from children on how to create welcoming, safe, and comfortable classroom environment
- Watch out any signs of child behavior that interferes with their ability to explore, play, and learn
- Encourage play and sports to promote between the students
- Model good coping behaviors for students---be calm, honest, and caring
- Take care of yourself and know your limits



Did you know? During times of stress and crisis, children observe adult's behaviors and emotions for cues on how to manage their own?

Ways to reduce stress and support student's well being during covid-19

1. Emotional check-ins



- Ask children "how they are in a direct or indirect way
- Signalling
- With reflection apps
- With emojis
- With a worksheet
- In their workbook
- For online/distance learning



2. Identifying signs of distress

3. Set activities to reduce stress

- Belly breathing
- Letter writing
- Drawing

- Tiredness
- Shortness of breath
- Stomach ache
- Poor concentration
