MONARCHS CLINCH AWARDS IN PH MATH CONTEST

High school students from Southville International School and Colleges (SISC) earned top awards in the national round of the 2022 Philippine International Mathematical Olympiad (PhIMO). Minsuk Kim of International Baccalaureate - 1 won a gold medal while Seojeong Park of Gr. 10 Commitment took a silver medal in the online contest held last April 10, 2022.

Bagging the bronze medal were Jiwon Jin and Geon Kim of Gr. 10 - Commitment, and Taebum Noh of Gr. 10 - Conviction. The PhIMO is organized annually by the Math Olympiads Training League Incorporated to select student representatives to international math competitions.

The onsite vaccination is another way for young SISC students to protect themselves, their families and their community during the coronavirus pandemic in the familiar environment of their school.

Vaccination is the leading public health prevention strategy against COVID-19. With the approval of the COVID-19 vaccine for younger children, getting vaccinated is key to making students learn in person in classrooms once again. As with other common vaccination programs for children under the age of consent, parental or guardian approval for their children's shots are required.

Why should Children and Teens Get Vaccinated Against COVID-19?

Just like adults, children and teens can also get very sick and spread COVID-19 to others, including at home and in school.



What you need to know?



- The Department of Health recommends children of ages 5 years old and older to get vaccinated against COVID-19.
- Everyone ages 12 years old and older can get a booster shot after completing their COVID-19 primary series.
- The COVID-19 vaccine dosage is based on age on the day of vaccination and not on weight.

Here are the Benefits of COVID-19 Vaccination for Children and Teens



- It will help protect against COVID-19, especially from severe disease, hospitalization, or death.
- It can reduce the likelihood of Multisystem Inflammatory Syndrome (MIS-C) in children ages 12-18 years old by 91%.
- It will help the children safely participate in sports, play dates, group activities, and other extracurricular activities.



Most Common Side Effects of the COVID-19 Vaccine for Children

- Pain, redness, or swelling at the injection site.
- Fatigue
- Headache
- Chills
- Muscle pain
- joint pain
- Swollen lymph nodes
- Nausea and vomiting
- Feeling unwell

Ways to reduce fever and discomfort on the injection site

- Apply a clean, cool, wet washcloth over the area.
- Use or exercise the arm.
- Drink plenty of fluids
- Dress lightly



When to see a Doctor

- If the redness or tenderness on the injection site gets worse after 24 hours
- If the side effects are worrying or do not seem to be going away after a few days.
