SISC's 5-17 year olds can get their COVID-19 vaccine at school

Southville International School and Colleges (SISC) students aged 5 – 17 years old can receive the first or second dose of the COVID-19 vaccine in Munich Campus on June 17, 2022. Those who have received a first dose during the on-campus vaccination program last month will be offered a second dose while those who haven't been vaccinated yet will be offered their first dose.

The school will once again be working with the Las Piñas City Health Office who will deliver the vaccine to protect students from the virus and prevent further disruption to their education. Like last time, parents or guardians will be asked to accompany and provide consent for their child or ward to receive his or her first or second vaccination.

School outreach receives appreciation for improving education standards

TIPS ON EXTENDING HELP AND PSYCHOSOCIAL SUPPORT



Just be there to listen. Empathize with the other person's situation by telling them you understand them. Show non-verbal behaviors that indicate interest and care.



Validate their feelings about the situation. If needed, tell a similar story and share how it is solved. Help them expand his/her perspective by offering an alternative view or pointing out consequences.



If you feel compelled to give an advice, do so in a non-patronizing way. Know that they may or may not take it. Help them get in touch with their values. Lastly, encourage them to seek for professional help.

Key Facts about Monkeypox

What is Monkeypox?

Monkeypox is a viral zoonosis (a virus transmitted to humans from animals) with symptoms similar to those seen in patients with smallpox. It was first discovered in 1958 and is endemic in West and Central Africa while occasionally exported to other regions.



Did you know?



The first human case of monkeypox was recorded in 1970 in the Democratic Republic of Congo (DRC) during a period of intensified effort to eliminate smallpox.

How is monkeypox virus transmitted?

- Animal-to-human (zoonotic) transmission comes from direct contact with the blood, bodily fluids, cutaneous or mucosal lesions of infected animals.
- Human-to-human transmission happens through closed contact with respiratory secretions or skin lesions of an infected person, or recently contaminated objects.

What are the symptoms of Monkeypox?

- Rash • Fever • Headache • Fatigue • Swollen Lymph nodes
- Blisters (beginning on the face) • Muscle aches

How can I protect myself against Monkeypox ?

1. Practice good hand hygiene.
2. Avoid contact with materials such as beddings that have been in contact with a sick animals.
3. Use personal protective equipment as necessary.
4. Practice physical distancing.
