## IB CLASS OF 2022 RETURNS TO CAMPUS AND CELEBRATES IN- PERSON COMMENCEMENT

## AVAIL OF THE SCHOOL-BASED COVID-19 VACCINATION

The school welcomes the high level of interest from families in the free COVID-19 vaccination for students aged 5 – 17 years old in Munich Campus on June 17, 2022. Those who have received a first dose during the on-campus vaccination program last month will be offered a second dose while those who haven't been vaccinated yet will be offered their first dose.

SISC is partnering with the Las Piñas City Health Office to provide a familiar and convenient location for eligible students to get vaccinated, and also family members from eligible groups. Like last time, parents or guardians will be asked to accompany and provide consent for their child or ward to receive his or her first or second vaccination.
