TRAFFIC SCHEME FOR LUXEMBOURG, MUNICH, TROPICAL & STAR CAMPUSES

To help decongest traffic during arrival and dismissal time, the following traffic schemes will be strictly implemented:

A. Traffic Guidelines for Luxembourg, Tropical & Munich Campuses

• No Parking and Tow-away zones: Luxembourg St., Lima St., Munich St., Yokohama St., and Tropical Ave. These are tow-away zones. The school shall not be liable for any towed vehicles parked in the towing zone area.

• Follow designated entrance and exit lanes.

• The inner lane is only for vehicles whose passengers are already waiting at the gate. Drivers whose wards are not yet at the gate, should never stall the traffic by staying more than a minute in the inner lane. Drivers should move on and come back when their wards are waiting at the gate.

• The outer lane should be kept open all the time for vehicles moving out.

B. Traffic Guidelines for STAR Campus

• NO PARKING ALONG ELIZALDE STREET. This is a tow-away zone. The school shall not be liable for any towed vehicles parked in the towing zone area.

• Vehicles coming from the Concha Cruz area are not allowed to do a U-Turn in Elizalde St. Instead, they should proceed to Aguirre St., make a U-Turn there, then turn right towards Elizalde Campus.

• U-Turn should be made after Batac St.

Quarantine, Isolation and Testing Guidelines

Isolation and quarantine help protect the public by preventing exposure to people who have or may have a contagious disease.

Asymptomatic close contacts: Testing is NOT recommended, unless symptoms will develop. The advice is to self monitor. Should testing still be used, it should be done at least 5 days from the day of last exposure.

Symptomatic close contacts: Immediate testing is required.

Quarantine: Separates and restricts the movement of people who were exposed to a contagious disease to see if they become sick.

Calculating Quarantine

The date of your exposure is considered Day 0. Day 1 is the full day after your last contact with a person who has COVID-19

COVID-19 Case Category	Vaccination Status	Required days of Quarantine
	Fully Vaccinated (at least 2 doses)	At least 5 days from last contact
Asymptomatic close contact	Partially Vaccinated or Unvaccinated	At least 14 days from last contact

Isolation: Separates sick people with a contagious disease from people who are not sick.

CALCULATING ISOLATION

Day 0 is your first day of symptoms or a positive viral test. Day 1 is the first full day after your symptoms developed or your test specimen was collected.

Isolation can be discontinued upon completion of the required days provided that you do not develop fever for at least 24 hours without the use of any antipyretics medications and should have improvement of respiratory symptoms.
