










SKIN RASH

What is a skin rash?

Skin rashes are abnormal areas on the skin that may appear as discolored bumps or flat spots. They occur when the skin becomes red, inflamed and bumpy.



Rashes occasionally affect people all over the world. Some rashes require no treatment since they quickly go away on their own, while others can be treated at home. Some rashes can be concerning because they may be symptoms of a more serious condition



Rashes may include a wide range of forms and textures, including those that are dry, moist, smooth, cracked, painful, itchy, non- itchy, and blistering. It may be infectious or non-infectious.

Types of skin rashes

Contact dermatitis This itchy rash is caused by a direct contact with a substance or an allergic reaction to it.

Eczema

Also called as atopic dermatitis, it often develops in infancy and frequently gets better as a child matures. Genetically, it typically runs in families and is more common in people with asthma or allergies.

Hives

Also known as urticaria, they result in raised, red, itchy welts on the skin. If you experience an allergic reaction to airborne allergens or insect bites, you could develop hives. Hives may also be triggered by severe temperature fluctuations and specific bacterial diseases.

Psoriasis

This chronic skin condition results in a thick, scaly rash. The elbows, knees, lower back, scalp, and genitalia are common areas where the rash appears.

Viral

Viral illnesses, such as chickenpox, measles and molluscum contagiosum, frequently exhibit skin rashes as a symptom.

Don't ignore RASH- get the relief you need!



Causes of skin rashes



Allergens in the environment



Bacterial infections



Skin conditions, such as eczema



Irritants



Viruses

How to prevent a skin rash

- Avoid known triggers such as allergens and irritants.
- Don't share clothing or other personal items with anyone who has a virus that causes rashes.
 - Use hypoallergenic, gentle and fragrance-free soaps, cleansers and moisturizers.
 - Wash hands immediately after coming into contact with a known allergen or irritant.



When to call a doctor?



Having severe trouble breathing which could indicate anaphylaxis (severe allergic reaction)



Appearing suddenly



Covering whole body



Spreading rapidly



Occurring with a fever



Forming blisters or open sores



Looking infected (red, warm and with yellow pus)
