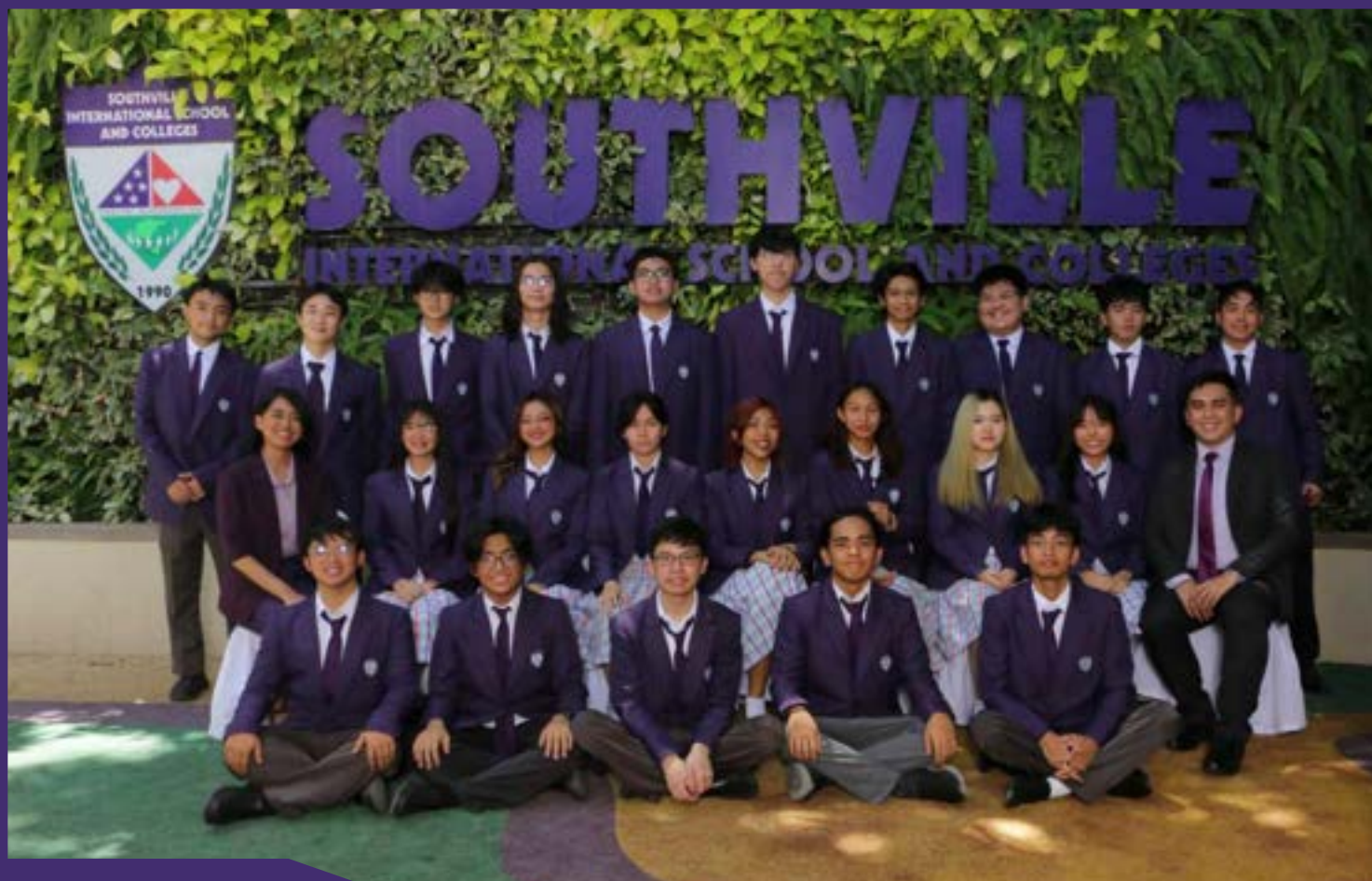

CONJUNCTIVITIS



Conjunctivitis, often called "pink eye" is the swelling or inflammation of the conjunctiva from infection or allergies.

Conjunctiva is the clear thin tissue that lines the inner surface of the eyelid covering the white part of the eye.

You can have conjunctivitis in both or one eye. It can be contagious but rarely serious.

Causes of Conjunctivitis

Conjunctivitis can be caused by a virus, bacteria or allergies. Bacteria and viral conjunctivitis easily spread from one person to another. Allergic conjunctivitis is not contagious.

Symptoms of Conjunctivitis

1. Swelling of the conjunctiva.
2. Increase tear production.
3. Feeling of there is something in the eye.
4. Irritation, itching or burning sensation.
5. Discharge- pus or mucus.
6. Puffy eyelids.
7. Crusting of eyelids or lashes especially in the morning.
8. Hazy or blurry vision and sensitivity to light.

Types of Conjunctivitis



Viral Conjunctivitis

This is the most common type of conjunctivitis. This type of pink eye is very contagious and often spreads in schools and crowded places. It causes burning, red eye with watery discharge. This is usually caused by the same virus that causes sore throat and runny nose in people with common cold.

Bacterial Conjunctivitis

This is very contagious characterized by sore, red eyes and very sticky pus. Sometimes, the bacteria that cause pink eye are the same virus that cause strep throat.

Allergic Conjunctivitis

This is not contagious, and comes from allergic reactions to pollen, animals, cigarette smoke, pool chlorine, car fumes or something else in the environment. The eyes become itchy and red with watery and puffy eyelids.

How it spreads



Through air by coughing & sneezing



Close personal contact such as touching or shaking hands



Direct contact with an infected person's bodily fluids usually through hand- to-eye contact

PREVENTION

1. Wash your hands with soap and water for at least 20 seconds or use an alcohol-based hand sanitizer with at least 70% alcohol to clean your hands.
2. Avoid touching or rubbing your eyes. This can worsen the condition or spread it to your other eye.
3. Wash pillow cases, sheets, wash cloths, and towels often in detergent and hot water; wash your hands after handling such items.
4. Stop wearing your contact lenses until your doctor says its okay to wear them again.
5. Do not share personal items such as pillows, washcloths, towels, eyes drops, eye or face makeup, brushes, contact lenses or eyeglasses.



TREATMENT



Treatment depends on the type of conjunctivitis you have. Conjunctivitis usually goes away on its own within 1-2 weeks.

Viral Conjunctivitis

- No specific treatment; your body fights the virus on its own.
- Placing a cool, wet washcloth on your eyes may help your eyes feel more comfortable.

Bacterial Conjunctivitis

- Antibiotic eyedrops may be prescribed by your Ophthalmologist depending on the severity of your symptoms

Allergic Conjunctivitis

- Use of certain eye drops can help with the itchiness and puffiness of the eyelids.



When to seek medical help



1. Pain in the eye/eyes.
2. Sensitivity to light or blurred vision that does not improve when discharge is wiped from the eyes.
3. Intense redness in the eye.
4. Symptoms get worse or do not improve after 1-2 weeks.
