# MONARCHS WIN IN SCI-TECH CHAMPS COMPETITION

Four Southville International School and Colleges (SISC) students bagged medals at the recent Brainiac 2023: Clash of the Sci-Tech Champs held at the University of the Philippines in Diliman, Quezon City. Ervin Joshua Bautista of Gr. 10 - Commitment earned a gold medal, Railey Emmanuel Ascaño of Gr. 8 -Integrity got a silver, and Edrigo Dauigoy of Gr. 12 - Grit and Joshua Levi Santos of Gr. 9 - Compassion received the bronze in the competition that aimed to increase interest in science, math and research.

By virtue of his victory, Bautista was also named Top Performing Student from the 126 participants who joined the contest. SISC, on the other hand, was declared as the Second Top Performing School among the 79 private and public high schools from the National Capital Region who competed in the event. The other members of the SISC delegation were Bang Changseong of Gr. 12-Grit, and Jin Jiwon of Gr. 11-Competence.

### Prevent Mosquito Bites



*Female mosquitoes bite both humans and animals because they cannot produce eggs without a blood meal. However, male mosquitoes do not bite people or other animals.*

#### What Happens When a Mosquito Bites You

A mosquito punctures the skin and sucks blood through a particular mouthpart called a proboscis. The mosquito injects saliva into the skin as it feeds. A lump and itching occur as a result of the body's reaction to the saliva.

Some people merely experience a minor reaction when they are bit. Others experience a stronger reaction, and a significant area of swelling, pain and redness may develop.

#### Common Symptoms

- A puffy and reddish bump appearing a few minutes after the bite
- A hard, itchy, reddish-brown bump, or multiple bumps appearing a day or so after the bite or bites
- Small blisters instead of hard bumps
- Dark spots that look like bruises



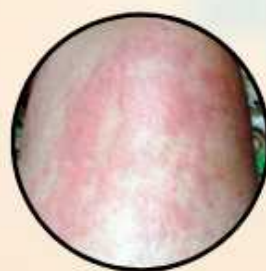
#### Severe Body Reactions



Large area of swelling and redness



Low-grade fever



Hives



Swollen lymph nodes



#### Treatment

- Wash the bitten area with soap and water.
- Apply an ice pack for 10 minutes to reduce swelling and itching. Reapply ice packs as needed.
- Apply a mixture of baking soda and water which can help reduce the itch response.
  - Mix 1 tablespoon baking soda with just enough water to create a paste.
  - Apply the paste to the mosquito bite.
  - Wait 10 minutes.
  - Wash off the paste.
- Use an over-the-counter anti-itch or antihistamine cream to help relieve itching. Follow the product label directions.



#### Prevention



- Control mosquitoes inside and outside the house by eliminating any stagnant water.
- Use a bug spray registered with the Environmental Protection Agency (typically containing DEET).
- Wear long-sleeved shirts and long pants.
- Treat clothing and gear with permethrin.
- Sleep under protective netting.
- Stay indoors during the highest point of mosquito activity (dusk and dawn).
- Utilize screens over windows and doors.
