The new school will be managed by Southville International School and Colleges (SISC) and serve students from preschool to Grade 2, with plans to add one grade per year.

Several officials from SGEN, the city of Gen. Trias, teachers, students, and guests came together for the ribbon-cutting ceremony, celebrating the completion of the new school. SGEN Chief Executive Mentor Genevieve Laurel, SM-IS Founder Rex Wallen Tan, SGEN President Jocelyn Tizon, and City Councilors Hernando Granados and Edwin Rodriguez all helped cut the ribbon to mark the beginning of access to international education close to home for Caviteños.

SM-IS is the eighth member school of SGEN, symbolizing its unwavering commitment to open doors for its learners to become leaders, innovators, and change-makers of tomorrow.
