SISC offers college credits to SGEN SHS students



Southville International School and Colleges (SISC) has launched the SHS College Advanced Placement Program (SCAPP) that allows senior high school students from the Southville Global Education Network (SGEN) to earn college credits while still in high school. They can earn general education college credits in Mathematics in the Modern World, Purposive Communication, Entrepreneurial Mindset, and Living in the IT Era before even starting at SISC College, thus saving them time and money.

To automatically qualify for the credit, a student must be a graduate of any of the SGEN schools with a grade of VS (Very Satisfactory) in the SHS equivalency subjects. They can also take the Advanced Placement Examination (APE), with a score of at least 91% earning them full credit for the corresponding subject. This credit will be reflected in their transcript of records (TOR) and will also be used for the computation of their Latin honors in college.

THINGS TO SAY WHEN YOUR CHILD TALKS BACK

Instead Of

Try

"Stop talking like that, you're being rude!"

"I understand you are not happy with that decision. It's okay to be upset about it. We still need to speak respectfully to each other."

"I'm not listening when you are talking like that!"

"In order for me to understand where you are coming from, we need to communicate with each other differently. Should we try that again?"

"Go to your room and calm down!"

"We're both feeling frustrated right now. Let's take some time to calm down and try again.
I'll be in the kitchen when you are ready."

All behavior is communication.

When a child acts rudely, try to understand what's really behind it.

Stress, anxiety, family dynamics, and the need for attention can cause challenging behavior. Aways give them the benefit of the doubt; unmet emotional needs, communication challenges, or limited life experience might drive their behavior.
