PTC set in January 2025

Read during the Christmas break

Research and personal experience show that reading skills deteriorate quite rapidly over a long break if they are not practiced. Twenty minutes reading each day maintains current reading level for improvement, at least forty minutes must be undertaken.

In order to limit language loss during the long Christmas break, students from Grade 6 - 12 will be assigned a holiday reading assignment which will be taken up in their English classes upon resumption of online classes. The recommended books per level are:



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DENGUE

Dengue is a viral infection that spreads from mosquitoes to people. It is the fastest spreading vector-borne disease in the world with the first infection usually non-severe or asymptomatic, while the second infection may cause severe dengue.



SIGNS AND SYMPTOMS



Severe Headache



High Fever



Nausea / Vomiting



Pain behind Eyes



Muscle and Joint



Rashes



MANAGEMENT OF DENGUE

- Supportive care with <u>analgesics</u>, <u>fluid replacement</u>, and bed rest
- Hospital admission for those with warning signs or with co-existing conditions



4S STRATEGY TO PREVENT DENGUE

look for breeding grounds; clean and dry the area to prevent stagnant water; clean roof, gutters or any possible breeding grounds



use mosquito
repellants, full sleeve
shirts and full pants
with socks, and
mosquito net for
sleeping infants and
young children during
day time to prevent
mosquito bite
