To the little girl who once feared uttering a single word to a big crowd—you'd be proud to see the love you now have for hosting.



B. Alumni's Dependent/s Discount

For newly enrolled alumni dependents, a discount of P5,000 in the 1st year of enrollment and P3,000 in the succeeding years will be given IB Alumni Dependent's Discount: \$100.00 for 1st year of enrollment and \$60.00 in the succeeding years.

C. Entry Level Discount

An entry level discount of P5,500 will apply to SISC graduates enrolling in Grade 1, Grade 7, and Grade 11.
