SISC INVESTORS DOMINATE STOCK TRADING CHALLENGE

Senior high school students from Southville International School and Colleges (SISC) took the top three places in the final ranking of the Southville Global Education Network (SGEN) Stock Trading Challenge 2025. Jassley Fatima Espiritu of International Baccalaureate (IB) - 1, Jisoo Lee of IB - 2, and Daniel Benileo Baniqued of Gr. 12 – Service placed first, second and third, respectively, in the individual competition for the best performing portfolio.

From an initial investment of Php 10,000.00, Espiritu had a return of 9.65%, Lee netted a 2.76% increase, and Baniqued showed a 1.08% profit in the contest featuring young investors from SISC, Southville International School Affiliated with Foreign Universities, South Mansfield College, Stonyhurst Southville International School – Batangas, Stonyhurst Southville International School – Malarayat and Asian SEED Academy of Technology (ASAT) engaging in real-time, hands-on trading in the Philippine Stock Exchange.




If we were all mean to each other, everyone would feel mad and sad. Our school —and even the whole world—would be a big disaster! That's why we should all just be kind.




