Asserting Openly One's Thoughts And Feelings

The value of the Week, "**Asserting Openly One's Thoughts and Feelings**" encourages us not to fear initiating dialogue by keeping a respectful tone in conversation. I believe that successful communication depends on expressing thoughts and feelings truthfully while showing sensitivity to others' emotions and keeping their personal information safe. When you communicate with others, you need to express your emotions honestly but also maintain caring actions that safeguard their well-being.



All students in my class are important to me, so I communicate my thoughts to them. It is true that sometimes that communication is challenging because I am in an online class. However, I experience the environment as real because I maintain the freedom to share my thoughts without fear of judgment from others. I practice humility because I understand that multiple viewpoints exist and people deserve respect for their beliefs. I share my ideas through a soft voice combined with respectful language, which I use to create an optimistic atmosphere to avoid coming across as dominant or controlling to others. Real communication needs genuine self-expression to create environments where everyone gains mutual understanding and value.

I try to use the right words for the situation when talking to others. I can communicate well because I've learned how to present my ideas clearly. My family taught me that having a conversation is about understanding each other, not arguing. I'm glad I can use these ideas to help my classmates, both as class president and when some of them ask me for help with subjects they're having trouble with. It feels great reaching out to them and helping with tutoring, especially since they can express thoughts or ask questions they might not feel comfortable asking the teachers. They can talk to me because we're both students, and I understand where they're coming from.

The fundamental principle for creating authentic relationships with others depends on honesty, together with moral behavior. This approach creates areas where individuals feel secure to express themselves freely without worrying about receiving negative reactions. I want to enhance this skill by helping others develop their abilities at the same time. People build better relationships through polite and humble communication, which also enhances their teamwork effectiveness. This leads to peace throughout the community. People build enduring relationships by communicating their thoughts and feelings with honesty and kindness.

WHY STRUCTURE AND CONSISTENCY ARE IMPORTANT FOR KIDS

Consistency means that we follow through with what we say we are going to do. It gives power to our words.

Giving second or third chances after a rule is broken teaches kids that if they push enough, they'll get their way. Holding firm shows our words have meaning.



Consistency allows boundaries and expectations to be set, which actually provides children with a sense of safety.

Unexpected changes can cause anxiety in kids. While we can't predict everything, consistent routines help them feel secure and adapt more easily.

Structures and routines also help kiddos learn how to control their behaviors.

When kids know the expectations and consequences, they choose their actions accordingly. Consistent responses help them adjust their behavior over time.
