GOOGLE LEADERS VISIT SISC TO STRENGTHEN DIGITAL LEARNING



Southville International School and Colleges (SISC) recently welcomed senior representatives from Google Australia and Google Philippines, including Kimberley Hall, Asia Pacific Digital

Transformation Lead, and Adrian Cruz, Digital Transformation Manager, Philippines, for a productive visit focused on bolstering technology integration in the school's learning programs. Representatives from Google Australia and Google Philippines, including Kimberley Hall, Asia Pacific Digital Transformation Lead, and Adrian Cruz, Digital Transformation Manager, PH, recently visited Southville to discuss AI, Chromebooks, and online certifications.

During their visit, SISC showcased how its use of Chromebooks has provided Grades 1-12 students access to personalized learning in mathematics, English and science through the IXL platform, and how AI tools are used to make lessons more interactive and boost student engagement. The school also proposed enhancements to Chromebook functionality to better support creative applications that match students' creative and technical aspirations. Dr. Marie Vic Suarez shared how Chromebooks have strengthened the IXL program, while Miss Nessie Lumbres highlighted the use of AI tools to better engage students. Sir Sam Bendo suggested enhancements for Chromebooks to support applications like SketchUp.





The Google team also met with SISC's top management and spent time with students at Monarchs Park, engaging in discussions about technology's role in education and observing firsthand how learners are using digital tools in the classroom.

"The goal of this collaboration is to ensure that Southville students are not just users of technology, but innovators who can leverage modern tools for learning and creation," said Dr. Avic Suarez, Principal of SISC. **"With Google's support, we aim to upgrade our technological infrastructure, enrich our digital curricula, and produce students who are future-ready."**

FROM SAFE SPACES TO STRONG MINDS: SEL FINDINGS FOR GRADES 5 AND 6

We are pleased to share with you the results of our recent Social-Emotional Learning (SEL) survey, which gives us a better understanding of how our Grade 5 and Grade 6 students see themselves, their school environment, and their relationships.

What We're Doing Well

Our students feel strongly supported in these areas:

- A Clean and Well-Maintained School (4.40) – Students notice and appreciate that their learning environment is well-equipped and cared for.
- Strong Teacher-Student Relationships (4.36) – They feel respected, valued, and guided by their teachers.
- A Safe School Community (4.23) – Students see school as a safe and respectful place where they can focus on learning.

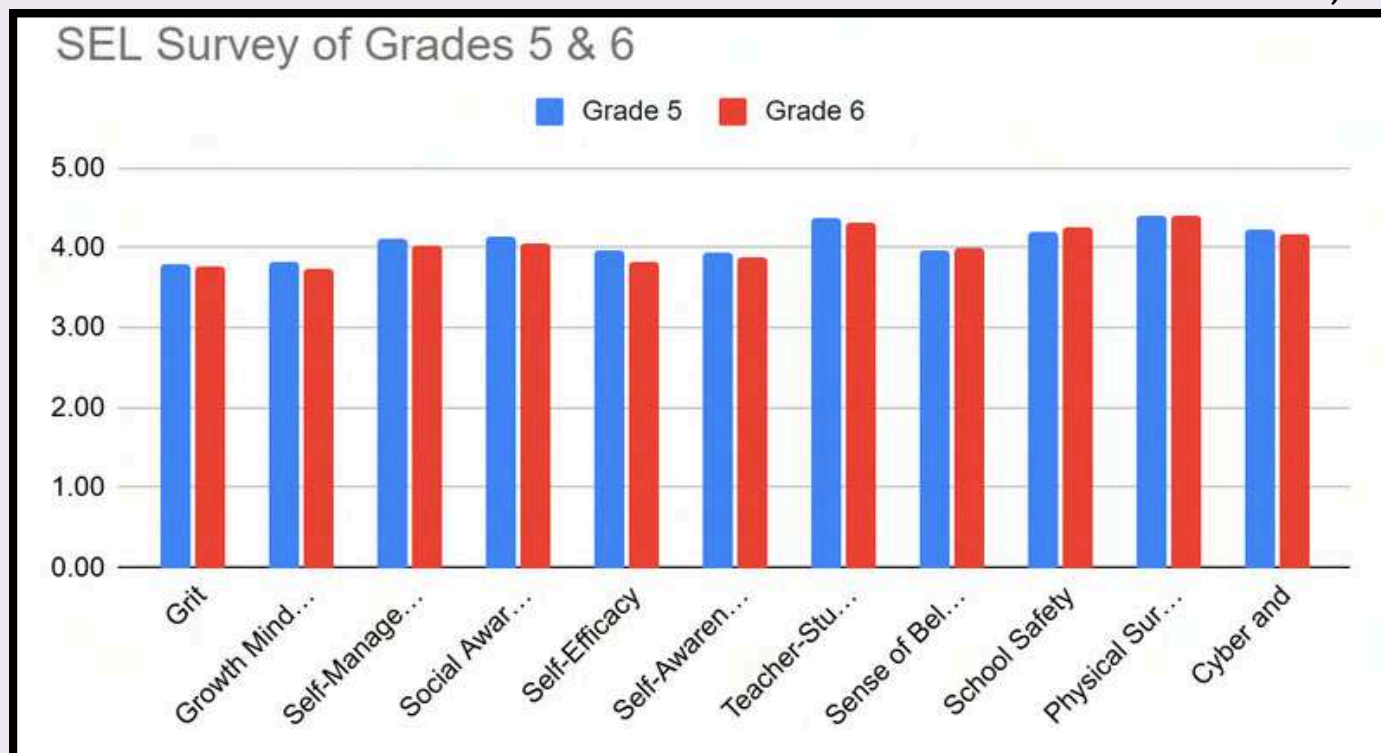
These results affirm that our school provides a nurturing and secure foundation for student growth.

Where We Can Grow Together

While the environment is very positive, students rated themselves lower in the following areas:

- Grit (3.79) – Some students find it hard to sustain effort when tasks become challenging.
- Growth Mindset (3.80) – While they believe skills and intelligence can improve, this belief needs strengthening.
- Self-Efficacy (3.91) – Students have moderate confidence in their ability to complete schoolwork successfully.

This shows us that while our students feel supported on the outside, we need to continue helping them build stronger confidence and resilience from within.



Moving Forward

Overall, our Grade 5 and 6 Monarchs feel safe, cared for, and supported at school. To further prepare them for future challenges, we will focus on developing their grit, growth mindset, and self-belief—empowering them not only to thrive in a positive environment but also to face difficulties with confidence and perseverance.

Together—as teachers, parents, and students—we can nurture both the safe spaces and the strong minds that will help our Monarchs soar even higher.
