PIONEERING EXCELLENCE: JERIANNE AND YESHIE ADVANCE IN LEAN SIX SIGMA CERTIFICATION

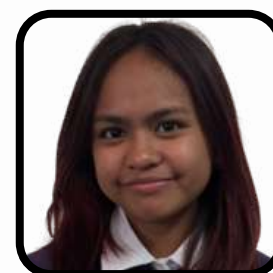

● **Green Belt** holders take this expertise further, leading projects and applying advanced analytical tools to solve real-world business problems.

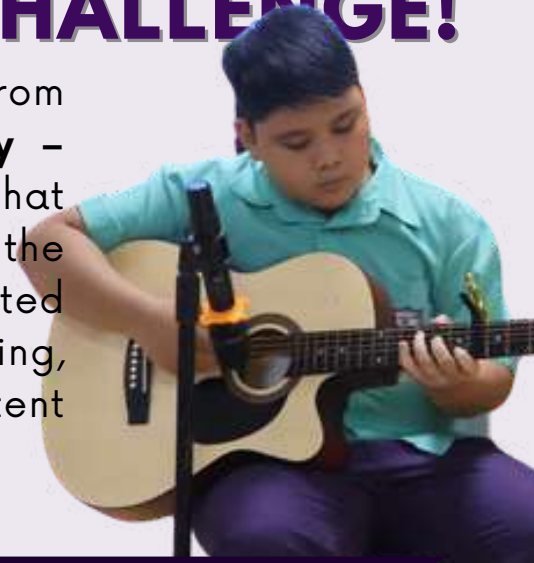

Having Direction and Determination

JOIN THE YOUNG CREATIVES CHALLENGE!

SISC encourages all students, natural-born Filipino citizens from **Grade 1 through Grade 12** to join the **DTI's Malikhaing Pinoy – Young Creatives Challenge (YC²)** — a national competition that celebrates the creativity of young Filipinos. With the launch of the Elementary and High School Editions, our young Monarchs are invited to explore their imagination and express their talents in songwriting, short story writing, graphic novel creation, and online content production. See the details below.



GRAPHIC NOVEL

This category encourages young storytellers to combine words and illustrations to create fun, meaningful, and creative stories. Through comics, cartoons, manga, and other similar forms, students can explore their imagination, develop artistic skills, and share stories that inspire and entertain others.

Entry Requirements:

- The entry must be a fully rendered graphic novel or any literature translated into a compendium of visual digital art.
- **For the Elementary Edition:** minimum of 5 pages and maximum of 10 pages.
- **For the High School Edition:** minimum of 10 pages and maximum of 15 pages.
- **Format:** A4 size, exported in high definition.

Files of be Submitted:

- Graphic novel - PDF format
- Synopsis - maximum of 200 words (Elementary Edition) or 300 words (High School Edition), PDF format.

SHORT WRITING STORY

Short stories are a creative way for young writers to share ideas, experiences, and imagination. This category encourages students to explore storytelling through characters, settings, & meaningful messages. Even with limited length, short stories can be powerful in showing how much can be said with only a few words.

Entry Requirements:

- The entry must be a work of fiction.
- **For the Elementary Edition:** 1,000 to 7,500 words
- **For the High School Edition:** 1,000 to 10,000 words.

Files to be Submitted:

- Short story - PDF Format
- Synopsis - maximum of 200 words (Elementary Edition) or 300 words (High School Edition), PDF Format



ONLINE CONTENT CREATION



This category encourages young Filipinos to express their creativity through fun and meaningful online content. It aims to showcase original ideas and talents while helping students explore digital platforms as a way to connect, share stories, and celebrate Filipino creativity.

Entry Requirements:

- The entry must consist of a series of three (3) short-form videos for the Elementary Edition and five (5) for the High School Edition.
- Each video must not exceed one (1) minute and should center on a unifying theme or concept.
- All videos must be uploaded to the participant's TikTok account using the following hashtags:
#YoungCreativesChallengeS3, #YC2S3, #YC2S3ElementaryEdition or #YC2S3HighSchoolEdition, and #DTIMalikhaingPinoy.
- For team entries without a dedicated account, videos must be uploaded to one member's TikTok account.

Files to be Submitted:

- Detailed summary of the content created (maximum of 200 words for Elementary & 300 words for High School), including links to videos - PDF format

SONG WRITING

Music is a fun and creative way to tell stories, share feelings, and connect with others. This category encourages young Filipino learners to explore their musical talents by writing original songs. It also supports the love for Original Pilipino Music (OPM) and aims to inspire the next generation of Filipino songwriters.

Entry Requirements:

- The entry must be an original composition
- The song must not exceed three (3) minutes in length and may be in any musical genre.

Files to be Submitted:

- Song demo - MP3 format
- Lyrics - PDF format
- Brief explanation of the song - maximum of 100 words, PDF format

The Malikhaing Pinoy - Young Creative Challenge (YC²) is a wonderful platform for our young Monarchs to express their originality, imagination, and artistic spirit. SISC is proud to support this DTI initiative that empowers students to showcase their talents and celebrate Filipino creativity.

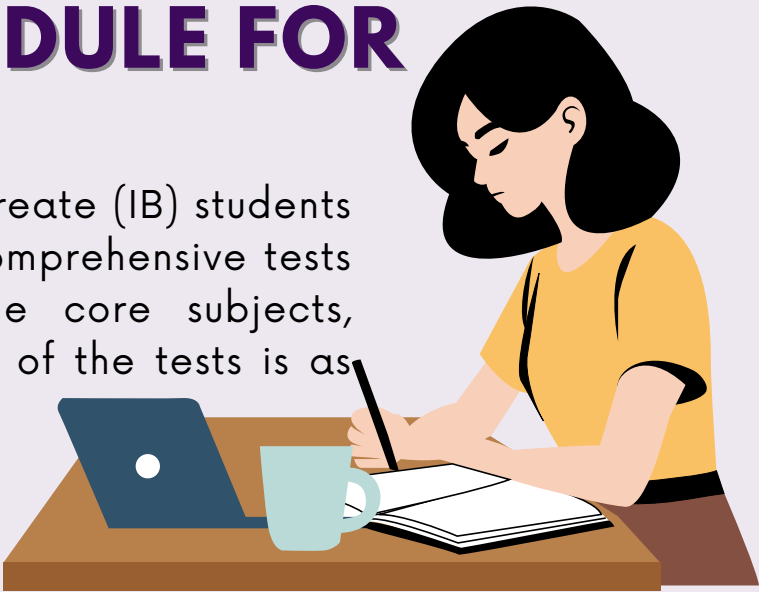

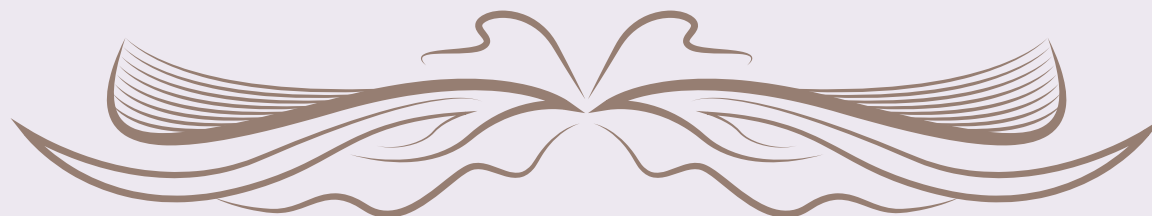

Parents and guardians of students who will go to EMY class will be notified by the Deputy Principal to inform them of the class schedule. A removal exam will be given to students who got a grade of LA and below after the EMY to ensure that the students gain the skills necessary to succeed in their level.

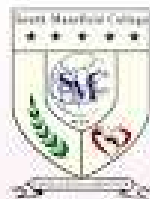
