
SISC COMMUNITY LACES UP AND GIVES BACK IN RUN FOR A CAUSE




















A MONARCH ON STAGE: NATALIA SHINES IN A CHRISTMAS CAROL

Monitor & Adjust

I monitor and possibly adjust what I do or say based on the goals I have of the situation and the expectations you have of me. And likely you are doing the same.



Awareness

In each situation, I am aware that I am thinking about you and that you may be thinking about me.



Realization

I realize you may be thinking about (or just noticing) me (and others in the situation), trying to figure out why we are present and what our motives, plans, or intentions might be



I think why you and others are here. What each of you are thinking or feeling. What you are doing, and/or why you may be doing it. I am trying to figure out your motive, intention, or plan.

Allergic Rhinitis (Hay Fever)

What is Allergic Rhinitis (hay fever)?

Allergic rhinitis (hay fever) is an allergic reaction to tiny particles in the air called allergens. When you breathe in allergens through your nose or mouth, your body reacts by releasing a natural chemical called histamine. Despite being called hay fever, hay doesn't cause hay fever and most people don't get a fever.

What triggers allergic rhinitis?

Several indoor and outdoor allergens cause hay fever. Common hay fever triggers include:

- Pollen from trees, weeds and plants
- Mold spores
- Pet dander
- Dust mites
- · Cockroach droppings and saliva

Prevalence

How Common is allergic rhinitis?



One in every five Filipino adults is affected by allergic rhinitis, making it a common health concern in the country.

Symptoms of hay fever include:

- Nasal stuffiness (congestion), sneezing and runny nose
- · Itchy nose, throat and eyes
- Red or watery eyes
- Headaches, sinus pressure and dark circles under your eyes
- More mucus in your nose and throat
- Tiredness
- Sore throat from mucus dripping down your throat
- Wheezing, coughing and trouble breathing
