SISC SPONSORSHIP PROGRAM: STRENGTHENING CARE, CONNECTION, AND COMMUNITY

The Sponsorship Program is a special guidance service of Southville International School and Colleges (SISC) designed to ensure that every student feels seen, heard, and supported. Through this program, each student is assured that there is always another trusted adult in school—beyond the classroom teacher—who is ready to listen, care, and help them feel that they truly belong in the SISC community.

Under the program, teachers and staff members serve as Sponsors, each assigned to a small group of students known as Sponsees. Sponsors meet with their Sponsees on a structured schedule—at least once per term or three times a year—to engage in open, meaningful, and purposeful conversations. These sessions provide a safe and welcoming space for students to share their experiences, celebrate achievements, and express concerns, knowing that they are valued and supported.

Beyond scheduled meetings, students are encouraged to approach their Sponsors whenever they need guidance or support, as long as the Sponsor is not in class. This open-door approach assures students that help is always within reach—whether they are facing academic challenges, social adjustments, or personal concerns. Sponsors also conduct follow-up meetings to monitor progress, affirm positive growth, and help students build resilience and healthy coping skills.



The Sponsorship Program likewise strengthens home-school partnerships by encouraging collaboration with parents, recognizing that student well-being is best supported when families and the school work together.

All parents and students are strongly encouraged to meet and get to know the assigned Sponsor of their child. This partnership helps ensure consistent support, open communication, and shared understanding of each student’s growth and well-being.

- 🥉 3rd Place – 50m Butterfly (Mixed, 9 years old and under)



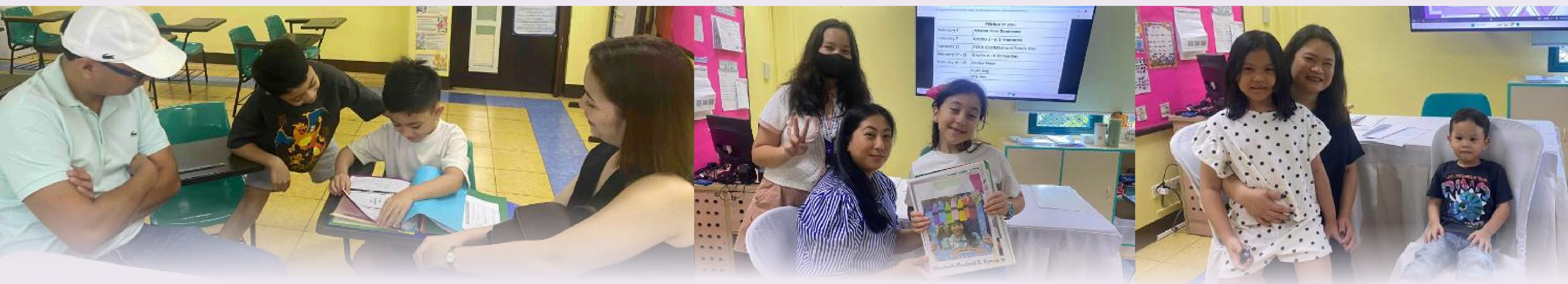

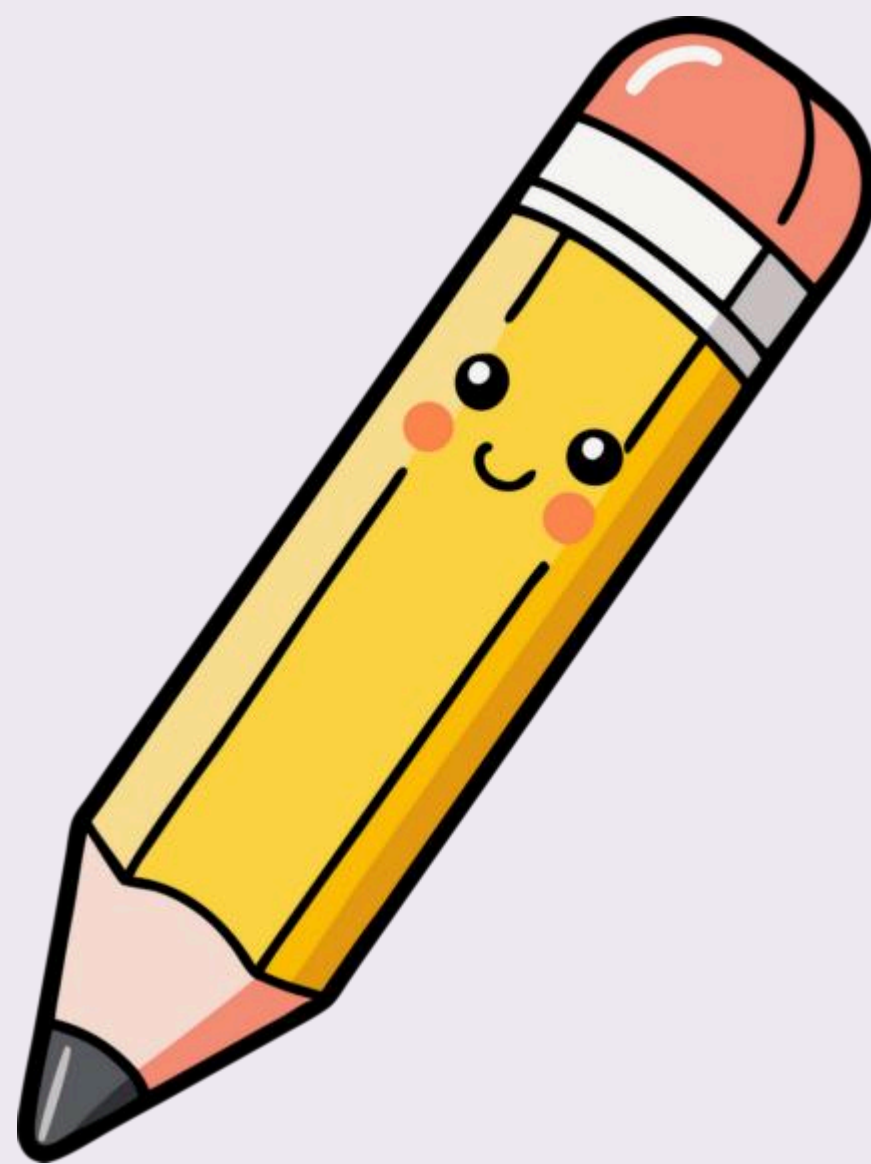
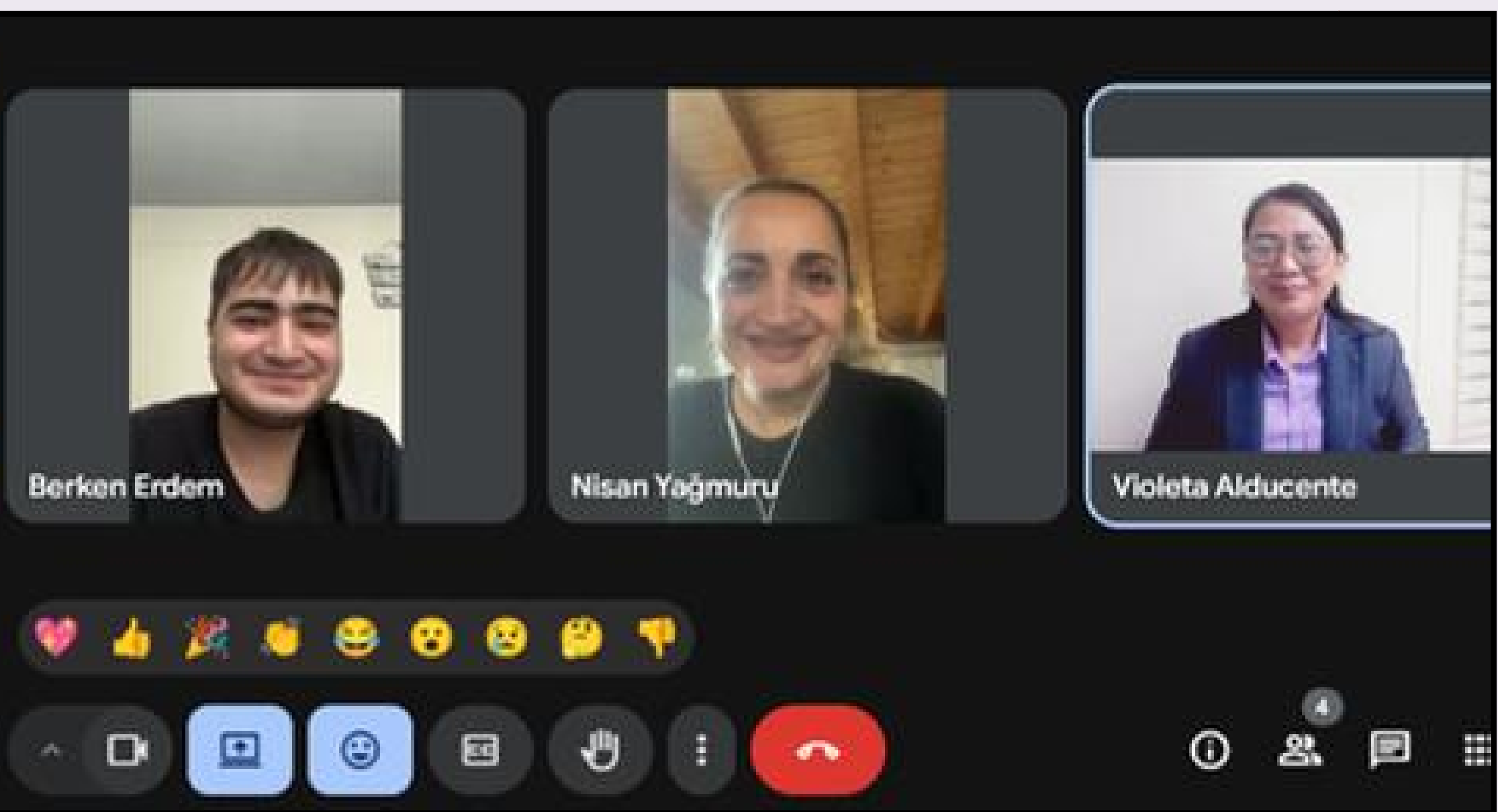
