



MONARCHS IN MOTION: EXCELLENCE BEYOND THE CLASSROOM



KNOW YOUR FEELINGS SHAPE YOUR ACTIONS

*Identify feelings and emotions, and their
Impact on Others*



NAME IT TO TAME IT

Naming emotions helps regulate behavior and prevents misunderstanding with others.

PAUSE BEFORE YOU REACT

When emotions run high, take a short pause, like taking a deep breath, counting to ten, or stepping away briefly before speaking or acting.


CHECK THE IMPACT, NOT JUST THE INTENTION

After expressing an emotion, reflect: "How did my words or actions affect others?"

Social-Emotional Learning Corner

KNOW YOUR FEELINGS SHAPE YOUR ACTIONS

Identify feelings and emotions, and their Impact on Others



USE "I" STATEMENTS

Communicate feelings using "I feel..." statements instead of blaming others.

Example: "I feel upset when I am not listened to" rather than "You never listen."

REFLECT THROUGH JOURNALING OR SHARING

Write in a journal or talk with a trusted friend, teacher, or counselor about your emotions and social experiences.


Measles

Measles is a highly contagious viral illness. It can spread through airborne droplets from sneezing or coughing, or by touching contaminated surfaces.

fever




rashes that starts on the face

Treatment and Management

There are no specific anti-viral medicines for the treatment of Measles.

Vitamin A supplementation may be prescribed to prevent complications.



pain meds



drink more water



plenty of rest



gargle with salt water



Do you have to isolate yourself if you have measles?

Yes, you should isolate yourself. Wear a facemask to prevent spread of airborne droplets. Before you return to work or school, secure a medical clearance from your physician.

Prevention

Community-wide vaccination is the most effective way to prevent measles.




To ensure immunity, children should receive 2 doses of MMR or MMRV.
