SGEN SETS GLOBAL GOLD STANDARD IN IXL MASTERY

In a massive show of academic grit and IXL fluency, SGEN schools namely, Southville International School and Colleges, Stonyhurst Southville International School Malarayat and Batangas, Southville International School affiliated with Foreign Universities, South Mansfield College, and Southville Monarchs International School have officially emerged as a leader in international education. A recent benchmarking study compared SGEN's performance against 13 other international schools abroad, and the results are clear: our students aren't just using IXL—they are dominating them.

The study analyzed data from IXL, the personalized learning platform, focusing on how effectively schools translate practice into real-world skill mastery. Here is how SGEN redefined the curve.

BREAKING THE NUMBERS: QUALITY OVER QUANTITY

While SGEN does not have the largest student population in the study group, it recorded the highest volume of engagement by a landslide. SGEN students answered over 10.5 million questions, proving that our community's work ethic is second to none.

However, the real story lies in the depth of learning. SGEN topped the charts in two critical categories:

As we celebrate these milestones, one thing is certain: SGEN students are prepared, proficient, and officially leading the way on the global stage.




DOST-SEI HONORS SOUTHVILLE'S YOUNG STEM TRAILBLAZERS WITH YES MEDALS



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

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

Your achievements inspire our entire community and remind us that with hard work and heart, our students can conquer the world — one problem, one solution, one dream at a time.






Once again, congratulations to all our awardees and classes! You inspire us all to read more, think deeper, and learn better.





emotional balance.

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
