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# Hemophilia

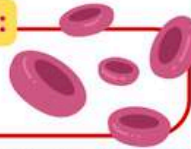
## Awareness Month

### What is Hemophilia?

Hemophilia is a bleeding disorder, usually inherited, in which the blood does not clot properly. This can lead to spontaneous bleeding as well as bleeding following injuries or surgeries.

**Caused by a deficiency in clotting factors:**

- Hemophilia A – lack of Factor VIII
- Hemophilia B – lack of Factor IX



**Hemophilia in the Philippines**

Estimated Cases **10,000 Filipinos**

**Hemophilia Worldwide**

Estimated Cases **400,000**

Most Common Type: Hemophilia A (~80%)



### Who is affected?

- Mostly males, but females can be carriers
- Usually inherited, but can also occur due to spontaneous mutation

### Signs and Symptoms

- Prolonged bleeding from cuts or injuries
- Frequent nosebleeds
- Easy bruising
- Bleeding into joints (causing pain and swelling)
- Blood in urine or stool

### How is it treated?

- Clotting factor replacement therapy
- Regular check-ups
- Physical therapy for joint health
- Preventive (prophylaxis) care



### When to seek Help

- Unusual or prolonged bleeding
- Sudden joint pain or swelling
- Severe headache after injury
