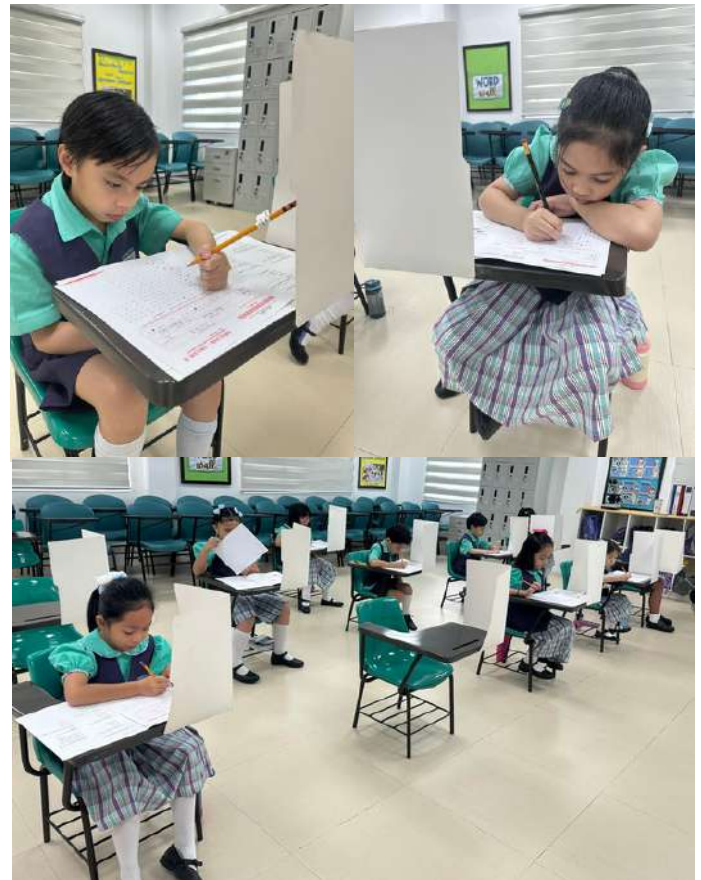

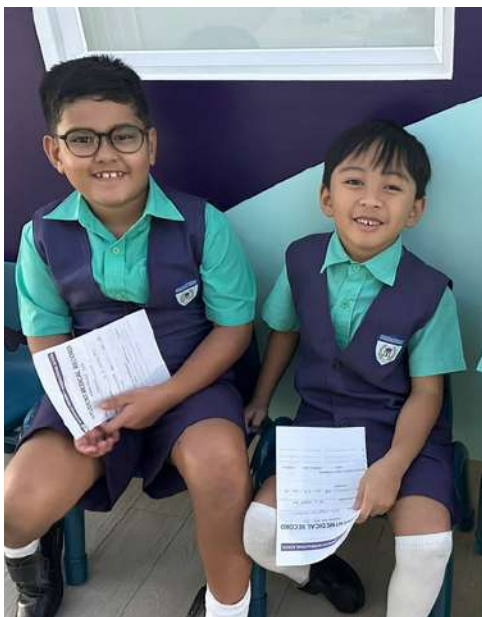
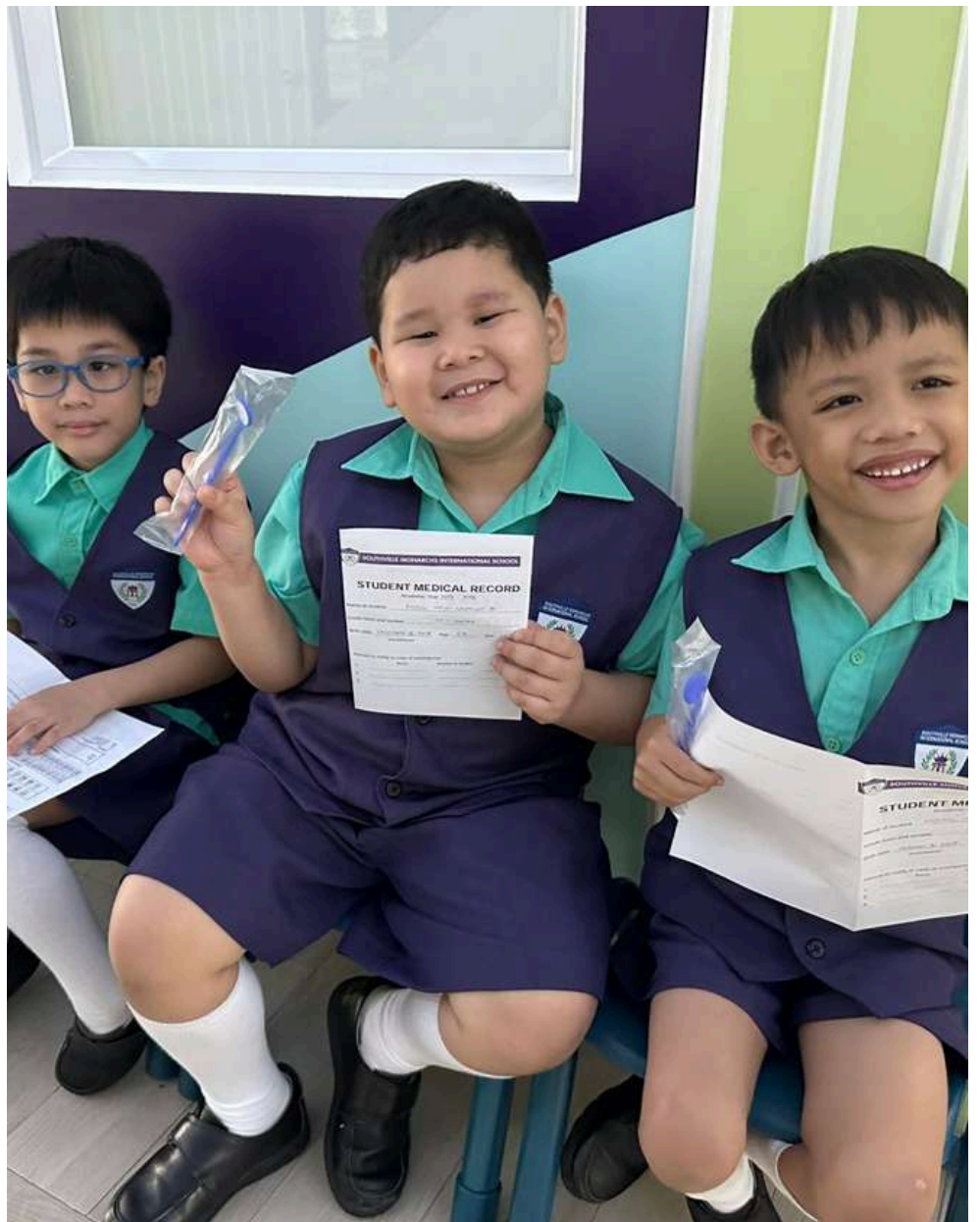

REMINDER TO ALL MOTORCYCLE AND E-BIKE RIDERS

For the safety and well-being of everyone in our school community, all student riders are reminded to strictly observe the following:

1. **Wear a Helmet at All Times**

- Protect your head. It's the law and it saves lives.

2. **Check Your Vehicle Before Riding**

- Always inspect brakes, tires, lights, and battery before you hit the road.

3. **Follow Traffic Rules and Speed Limits**

- Obey signs, signals, and stay within safe speed limits.

4. **Use Hand Signals and Lights**

- Let others know your intentions to turn or stop. Be visible.

5. **Avoid Sidewalks and Pedestrian Lanes**

- Ride only where permitted to avoid accidents and penalties.

6. **Do Not Overload**

- Carry only the recommended number of passengers or weight.

7. **Stay Alert and Avoid Distractions**

- Keep both hands on the handlebars and your eyes on the road.

8. **Wear Proper Gear**

- Closed shoes, reflective clothing, and gloves can prevent serious injuries.

9. **Charge Safely (for E-Bikes)**

- Use certified chargers and never overcharge or leave batteries unattended while charging.

10. **Respect Pedestrians and Other Drivers**

- Be courteous and share the road responsibly.





EARTHQUAKE SAFETY FOR STUDENTS

DROP

Drop to the ground immediately.



COVER

Take cover under the study desk or table. Protect your head and neck.



HOLD

Hold on until the shaking stops. Stay put until safe.



ALARM

Alert others or sound the alarm.



EXIT

Use stairs or fire exits only. Avoid elevators and unsafe structures.



EVACUATE

Proceed to the evacuation area. Wait for Attendees and assistance.

LEPTOSPIROSIS

Leptospirosis is caused by *Leptospira* bacteria found in both wild and domestic animals

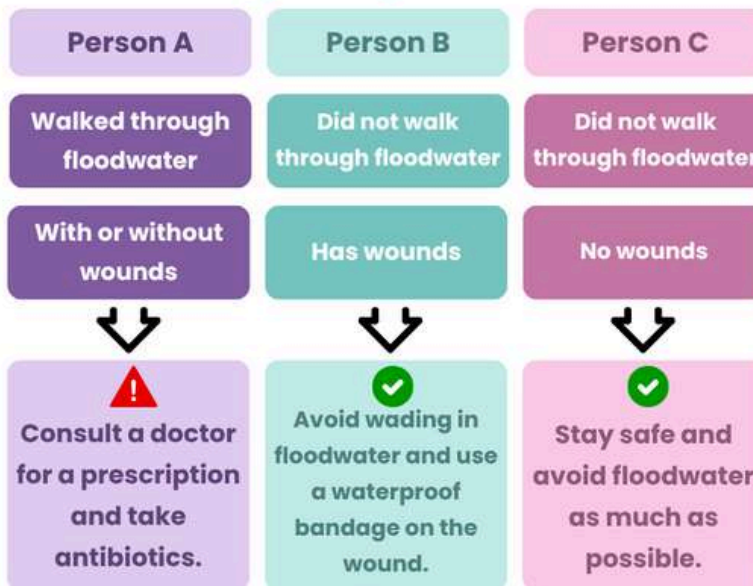


How is it Transmitted?



Leptospirosis spreads during floods through contact with water contaminated by urine from infected animals, especially rodents. It can enter the body through cuts, mucous membranes (eyes, nose, mouth), or by swallowing the water.

Steps to prevent Leptospirosis



REMINDER: Visit your doctor or local health center for a check-up. A proper diagnosis and prescription are needed before taking medicine for Leptospirosis.
