MONARCHS STAMP CLASS IN 2026 WORLD SCHOLAR'S CUP GLOBAL ROUND

The Southville Monarchs once again proved their excellence on the global stage as they delivered an extraordinary performance at the prestigious World Scholar's Cup, earning an impressive haul of 171 Silver Medals, 123 Gold Medals, and 6 Overall Trophies across various categories in both the Junior and Senior Divisions.

Our scholars showcased exceptional brilliance in Debate, Writing, Team Bowl, and Challenge Events, demonstrating not only academic mastery but also creativity, collaboration, critical thinking, and global awareness. Among the highlights of the competition was the remarkable achievement of the Senior Division team composed of Angelo Buenafe, Lucas Christopher Rodriguez, and Hua Fei Tan, who emerged as one of the competition's Top Overall Champion Teams and earned multiple distinctions in Team Debate, Team Bowl, and Global Qualifiers.

Several Monarchs also received prestigious individual recognitions as Debate Champions, Writing Champions, Champion Scholars, and Challenge Medalists in subjects such as Science, Literature, History, Social Studies, Art, and Special Area. The team's resilience, eloquence, intellect, and teamwork truly embodied the spirit of global scholarship and leadership.

Adding to this milestone was the recognition of Maria Klaudia Klara Navarro, recipient of the Asimov Award for Most Resilient Scholar, a testament to perseverance and determination in the pursuit of excellence.

These achievements reflect the passion, dedication, and world-class caliber of Southville Monarchs who continue to raise the banner of excellence in international academic competitions.

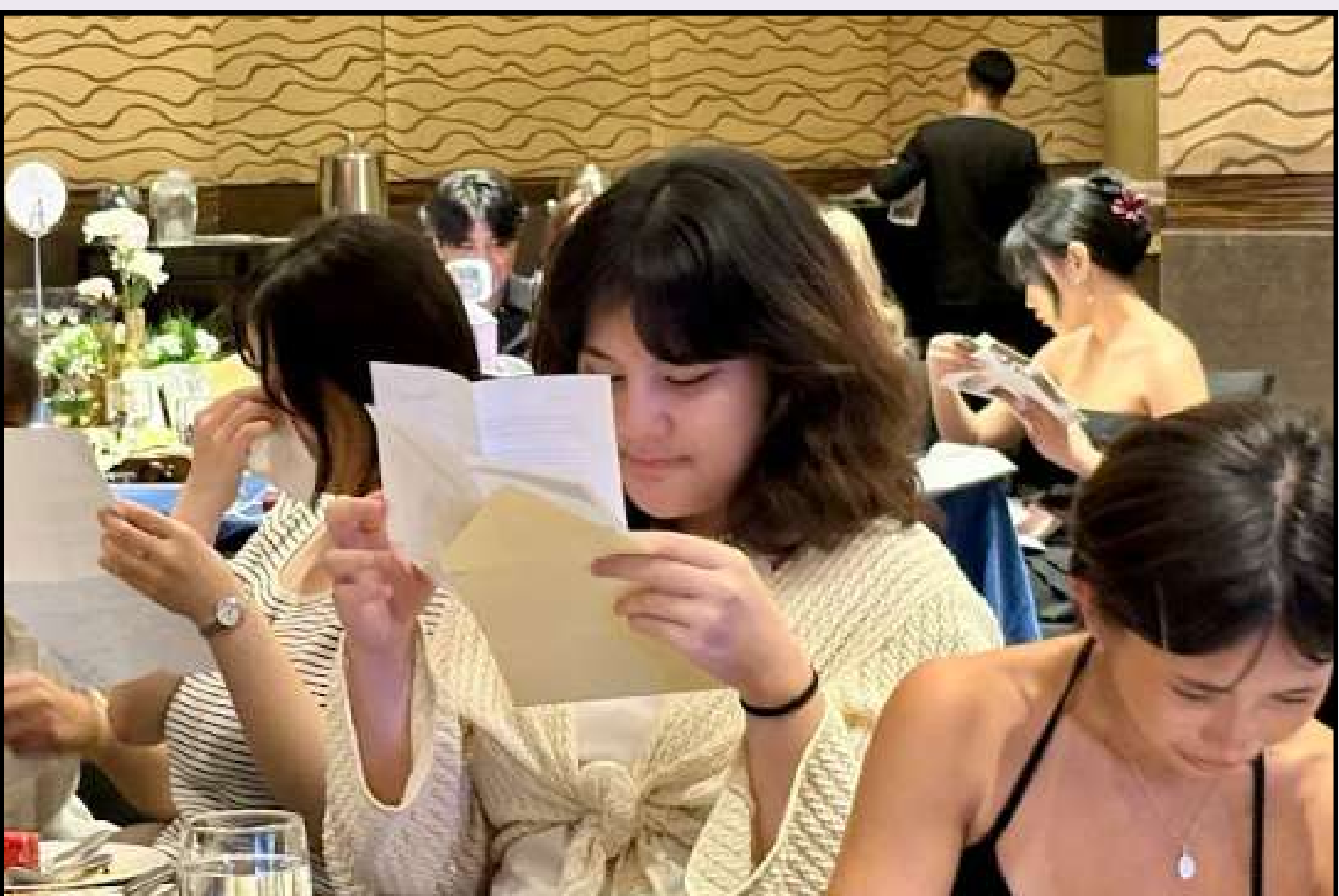
