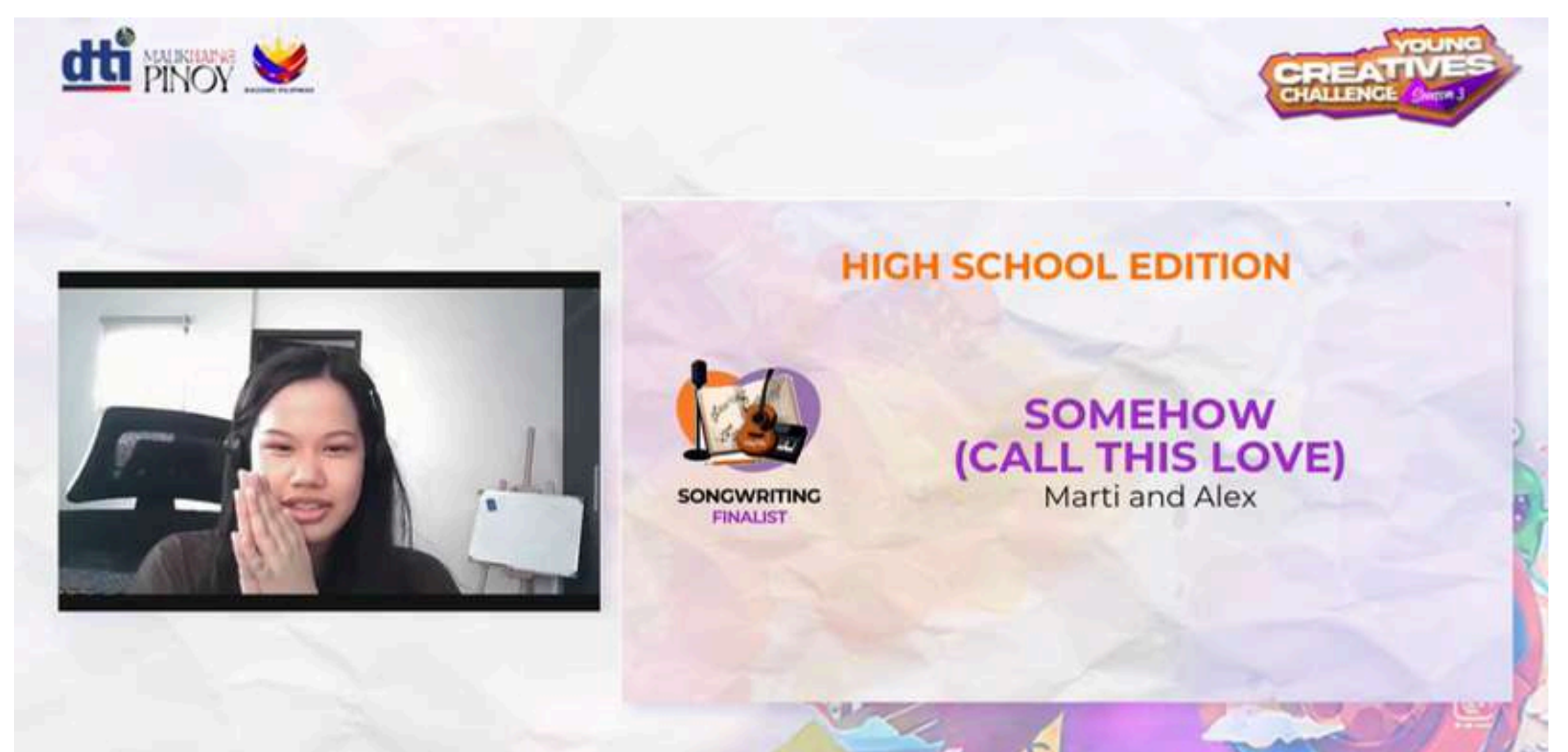

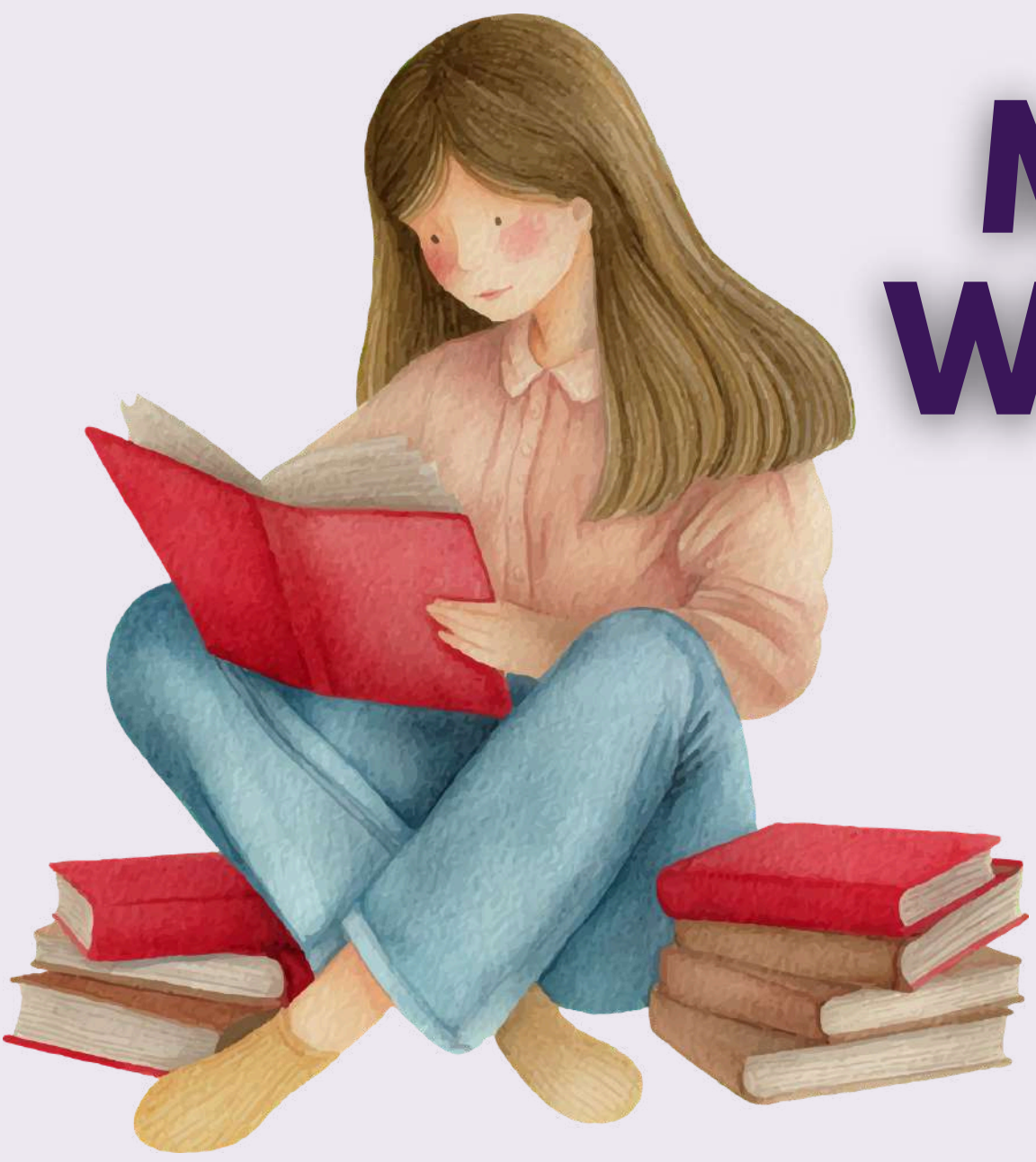

We congratulate Iain and Marti for this remarkable achievement and for representing our school with excellence, creativity, and literary talent on the national stage.





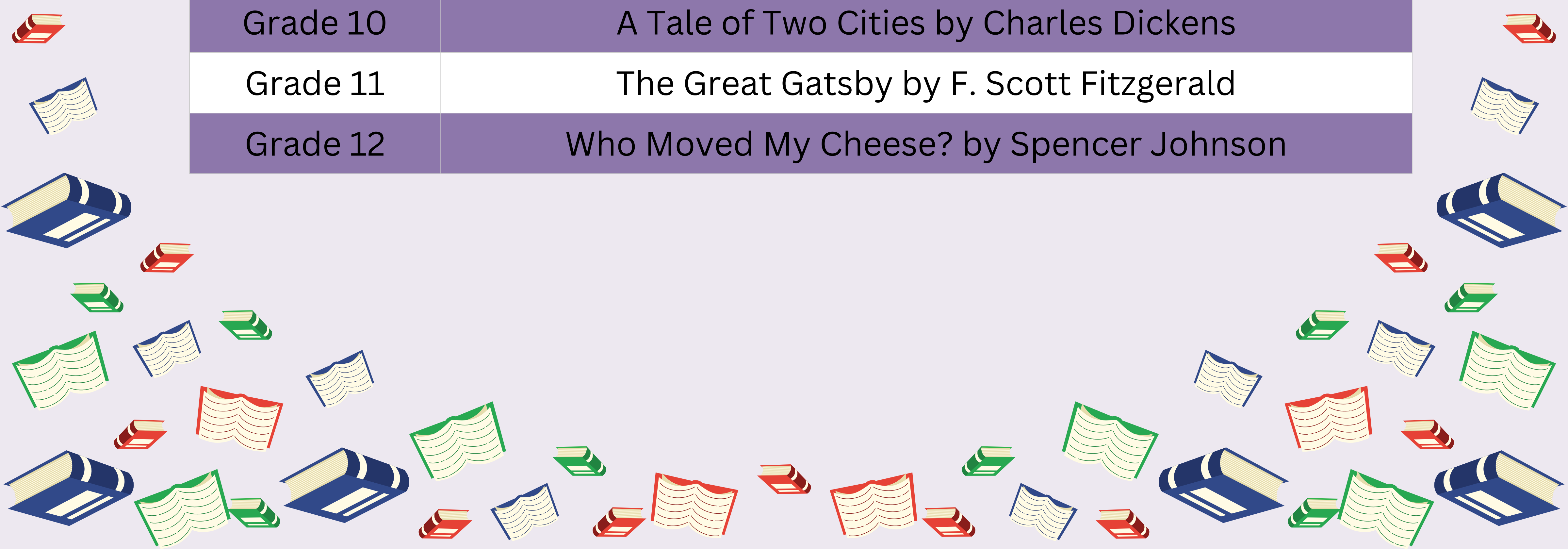
MONARCHS KEEP PAGES TURNING WITH SUMMER READING CHALLENGE

Research consistently shows that students who read little or not at all during the summer months often experience a decline in reading ability. Even reading just one engaging book over the vacation can help students maintain vocabulary, comprehension, critical thinking, and a lifelong love for learning.

To help students return to school confident and prepared, Southville is requiring all Grade 1 to Grade 12 students to read at least one book from the school's carefully curated Summer Reading List before the opening of classes. The selected titles are age-appropriate and designed to inspire imagination, curiosity, empathy, and thoughtful reflection while allowing students to enjoy reading at their own pace.
